

## DT

The task for this term is to design a tomato-based pizza wrap with toppings/herbs for a gluten free diet. The children will design pizza wraps looking for the most cost-effective way to produce them. They will create their own recipe/instructions to make the pizza that they can then re-create at home with an adult.

## PE

This term the children in Y3/4 will be developing their net skills with sports such as tennis. They will also learn a variety of athletic disciplines, including running, hurdles and javelin. The various sports will support the children in all areas of physical activity.

## RE

This term, the children will explore how Christians believe the world was first created. They will seek to answer the 'Big Questions': What does it mean to live a good life? Believing, Living, Thinking

## Physical, Social, Emotional Health and Well Being

The children will focus on hazards at home and at school and how these can be identified and overcome. In addition to this, children will learn about how to stay safe in the local environment and unfamiliar places.

## What we are learning:

The topic for this half term is 'Global citizens and Global communities'.

The children will develop their knowledge and understanding of individuals and families choose to spend their money in different ways, sources of income, expenses, savings and budgeting.

## Key Skills - English

In English, your child will be reading the text The Tin Forest. During this time, the children will be developing a range of reading and writing skills. They will write their own descriptive setting using The Tin Forest as a stimulus. Your child will develop their comprehension skills and be able to discuss and answer a range of questions in relation to their text. They will also have the opportunity to debate and write instructions linked with our DT project and financial education lessons.

## Home Learning Opportunities:

Home reading is essential to developing your child's reading. Please encourage your child to take part in the 10 minutes a day reading challenge.

In addition, if you could practise any tables and division facts with your child this will really help them as these facts form an important part of the maths curriculum. If you need a reminder of how to access TT Rockstars then please speak to your child's teacher.

## Music

In Music, the children will listen to and appraise a range of genres of music. The focus will be to reflect on a piece of music then be able to rewind and replay it with any edits.

## French

Your child will listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding. As well as beginning to learn how to speak in sentences, using familiar vocabulary, there will be a focus on months of the year and hobbies.

## Maths:

In Year 3, children will develop their understanding of 2-D and 3-D shapes. Being able to recognise these shapes by their properties. In addition to this, children will build on their prior knowledge of measures to enable them to use grams, kilograms, millilitres and litres.

In Year 4, children will classify and compare geometric shapes based on their properties. This will include being able to identify the different types of angles - acute, obtuse, right angles.

They will also describe positions on a 2-D grid using coordinates and describe the movements between positions as translations.
