Where in Brazil is Rio de Janeiro?

Rio de Janeiro is the capital city of Brazil.



What is a human feature?

A human feature is something that has been built by humans. Christ the Redeemer is a human feature, a landmark in Rio and sits atop the Corcovado mountain.

What is a physical feature?

A physical feature is a feature, which is not made by a human; it is naturally on the Earth – like a river. Sugarloaf Mountain is a physical feature.

What is Rio like?

Brazil is a country in the continent of South America.

Rainforests cover about half of Brazil. The Amazon rainforest is the biggest in the World.

Portuguese is the language spoken in Brazil.

In Rio, large numbers of people live in favelas. (22%)

Carnival is an annual celebration in the Catholic religion.

Rio has hot summers, warm winters and a lot of rain between December and March.

How is Rio similar to Cleethorpes?

Cleethorpes is in the county North East Lincolnshire, which is a county in England.

Rio and Cleethorpes are both on the coast and have a beach. Tourists visit Rio and Cleethorpes.

How is Rio different to Cleethorpes?

Rio is a city while Cleethorpes is a town.
Rio is bigger and has a higher population.
Rio is warmer than Cleethorpes.
