

### Re-Opening Information for Nursery – full time children

We are very happy to welcome Nursery back to Elliston. It has been a strange time for us all and I know the children, like the staff, will be keen to get back to some form of normality. They may feel anxious and it is important for us not to dismiss these feelings. We need to tell them that it is OK to be worried but we will work together as a team to look after each other. Getting back to learning with their friends will be the best remedy! There may be some parents feeling concerned too but I hope the information we have provided helps you to feel confident in them returning to school. Remember anxiety is catching; we must guard against children seeing and listening to our fears. It is our job to reassure them and help them to feel safe and secure.

### Social Distancing measures

**These will be expected by anyone coming to Elliston and on the way home from Elliston. Signage will indicate waiting and walking areas for adults and children. Staff will be on hand each morning to ensure these are understood and followed.**

### Entry to school for Nursery

The normal gate for Nursery on Bramhall Street - a member of staff will be there to show you. Parents may come into the school grounds and follow the markings around the playground up to the door. Your child can look for the 5.4.3.2.1 to jump on until you reach the 'Hug Zone' If you need to wait for the gate to open, you must maintain social distancing of 2m in the queue.

Please only arrive at the times below according to surname. This allows us to stagger the amount of people around the school grounds at any one time and allows children space to wash hands thoroughly on entry to school and before leaving for home. Once you have dropped your child at the door, you will need to walk down the side of the school (along Penny Lane) and leave by the larger gate on Bramhall Street. Signs will be around to show you.

We ask that only one adult drops off and picks up children where possible. Start and finish times below are allocated by the first letter of your child's surname.

If you are a key worker and need to take advantage of the Key Worker hours, this can be agreed with Miss Willis – please contact the office. These children will not move to the Key Worker group but will stay with their teacher until home time.

### Classes

The Government recognises that young children will find it difficult to stay 2m apart from each other and staff. However, we have worked through the recommended guidance of minimising contact, not mixing groups of children and adults, creating much smaller teaching groups and ensuring staggered movement around school for times like lunch and break. We have also changed the layout of the classroom to reduce the amount of furniture and resources in each. This will help us with maintaining a clean and safe environment. In order to allow children as much space as possible, the children coming back will be split into 3 classes as follows. They may be in a different class to their normal but they will always be with at least one of their friends. The adults in each groups will be the only adults your children comes into contact with throughout the week. Nursery children will use both Foundation classrooms to allow them more space to play.

### Safety reminders

- Hand washing will be expected by all children and staff at regular times throughout the day.
- We continue to expect outstanding behaviour from all children; incidents of inappropriate behaviour that puts staff and other children at risk will not be tolerated.
- No equipment or toys or PE kit are to be brought into school– these pose a health risk to other children and staff.
- Equipment in school will not be shared.
- Children will take their coats and packed lunches into their classroom.

- Water bottles can be brought into school and left until the end of term – these will be washed in an industrial cleaner at the end of everyday by the adults, all bottles must be named with a permanent marker. Alternatively, bottled water may be brought in plastic bottles and binned at the end of the day.
- If you or your child displays any symptoms of COVID-19, as identified by the Government, **do not attempt to come to school**. Ring the school office and we will be able to advise you of testing processes. Isolation guidance will apply for unless a negative test result is secured.
- Any child taken ill with COVID-19 symptoms in school will go to an isolation room and you will need to collect him/her plus siblings immediately. We will need up to date contact details for all parents/carers.
- Any First Aid issues that are not COVID-19 related will be treated and communicated to you as we would normally.
- FOR ANY FIRST AID, staff will wear PPE to protect themselves and the children. You can let the children know this to ensure this is not a worry for them. PPE will be apron, gloves and mask. The same will apply for any member of staff helping a child who has had a toilet accident at school.

You can help by:

- Talking through this plan with your children and contacting us should you have any questions
- Reminding children about good hand washing and good hygiene when sneezing and coughing
- Following the social distancing measures we have put into place
- Ensuring your family follows the social distancing guidance in your home lives as guided by the government.

We know the children will be very excited to be back and we will be sending them a special letter before the weekend for you to read to them, this way they know what will be happening when they arrive. I hope that after their first day back with us, your child will be able to tell you that there may be some things that look different in school but the heart and soul of Elliston has not changed.
