See these places where kids can eat for free or for £1 over the October half term.

- Asda Cafe- Kids eat for £1 all day, every day with no adult spend.
- Sizzling pubs- Sizzling Pubs. Monday to Friday, 3pm to 7pm, kids' mains are £1 with every adult meal
- Beefeater and Brewers Fayre-Two children under 16 can get a free breakfast every day with one paying adult
- Tesco Cafe- Kids east free with any purchase of fresh fruit
- Morrisons-Spend £4.99 after 3pm daily and get one free kids' meal
- Hungry Horse- Kids eat breakfast free with every adult breakfast, daily from 9am-12pm
- Farmhouse Inns- Kids eat free for £1 when you sign up to their email list
- Stonehouse Pizza & Carvery- Kids can east for just £1, with an adult meal
- Marks and Spencer's- Kids can eat free when you spend £5 or more in the cafe



EHCP Annual Review

Is your child's EHCP Annual Review coming up?

Remember that you can both see a copy of their plan before hand. It helps to remind you of what was expected and prepare any questions that you may have.

Give us your feedback after the review. It's an important part of the process. Your child can do the same.

At this time, it's a good idea to think about encouraging your older child of 14 and older to start going to their Annual Health Checks. They will need to be on their doctor's learning disability register.
