Covid



From 30 November for at least three weeks, Government have introduced temporary measures to respond to the emergence of UK cases of the new variant of COVID-19, Omicron.

The Government have done this to try to slow the spread of the new variant in the UK while work is done to find out as much as possible about the variant.

In a temporary measure, Government have introduced three key aspects for businesses. From 30 November for at least three weeks:

- Face coverings are mandatory to wear on public transport and in retail premises unless you are exempt. This applies to most high street premises (shops, shopping centres, post offices, banks, personal care and beauty treatment premises, travel agents, takeaways etc)
- All arrivals into the UK from abroad need to take a PCR test by the end of day 2, and must self-isolate until a negative result is received

All contacts of those with the suspected variant, Omicron, must self-isolate for 10 days, regardless of vaccination status. These will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace.

Masks and SEND

Children aged 12 and over should wear masks.

If you have an age, health or disability reason for not wearing a face covering:

- you do not routinely need to show any written evidence of this
- you do not need to show an exemption card

This means that you do not need to seek advice or request a letter from a medical professional about your reason for not wearing a face covering.

However, some people may feel more comfortable showing something that says they do not have to wear a face covering. This could be in the form of an exemption card, badge or even a home-made sign.

Carrying an exemption card or badge is a personal choice and is not required by law.

Climb4 sis a social enterprise that works with vulnerable families and children and young people across North East Lincolnshire.

They joined the regular 'parent carer Covid meeting' to share the variety of programmes that they offer.

- They have an employability programme for women aged 18 and over. It focuses on personal development and positivity before employment.

- After school and holiday activities. They have activities at four different venues. Parent and baby sessions and the funded HAF programme for children who get free school meals.

Children and young people with SEND are welcome to join. If you have an EHCP they ask that you send it to them to make sure that they can give your child the support that they need.

They have a teaching assistant that is SEND trained and can hire additional staff members through an agency if your child's needs are higher.
