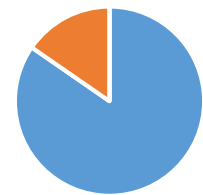
- Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity

- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport

The National Curriculum aims are:

- Children to be physically active throughout the school day.
- Children to participate and experience a range of PE and sports activities
- Children to engage in competition
- Children to lead Healthy Lifestyles

Elm Church of England Primary School aspires to ensure all children have the opportunity and means to participate in high quality sport provision within, and in addition to the curriculum.
