

PE and Sport Premium

How to use the PE and Sports Premium?

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

This means that you should use the premium in line with the 5 Key Indicators

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity a recommendation that children 5-18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, 30 minutes should be in school
- 2. The profile of PE and Sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge, and skills of all staff in teaching PE and Sport
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5. Increased participation in competitive Sport

Develop or add to the PE and sports activities that your school already offer.

Make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

For example, you can use the funding to:

- Hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- Provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- Introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- Support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4life clubs
- Run sports competitions or run sports activities with other schools
 - Increase pupils' participation in School Games
 - Improve pupils physical, mental and social well being

We have increased the amount of pupils now taking part in Swimming, this was one of our biggest success throughout Covid and lockdowns. Upper KS2 completed swimming until pools shut down. Our specialised class was able to swim weekly in a specialised venue which was appropriate for their needs. We have been able to use the funding for TOP Up swimming for children who were unable to swim 25 metres before leaving at Year 6.

We are committed to ensuring swimming is a priority in school to cover safe self-rescue, more children in 2021-2022 will be taking part in swimming. Our specialised classes, KS2 and EYFS.

There are a few new initiatives that Elm Tree is looking to promote over the coming 2021/2022 academic year to encourage fitness, participation and healthier lifestyle choices.

Due to pandemic since March 2020, children have lost a lot of physical activity time. Some of our initiatives were not met last year due to the closure of schools, restrictions and bubbles in school. We will be working diligently to ensure children in school are safe and encourage them to engage and participate in a happy and safe environment.

The mile a day initiative will be reintroduced across the school over the first term in order to encourage team work, personal achievement and healthy lifestyle choices. The route of the mile has been shared with all members of staff, this was utilised well by some classes but we want all classes to engage in it. Children in some classes really benefited from it as they needed a movement break and this was an ideal situation to get those steps in. Secondly an intra-school competition where classes will compete in team games and events against each other over the curricular year is to be organised which will promote team work, fair play, fun activity and a friendly sense of competition. This was successful last year before school closed as we had a huge football tournament. Unfortunately, due to bubbles intra spot struggled, but beforehand it was successful so will be a priority. Other sporting tournaments will be added to the calendar this academic year.

Key achievements to date

- Annual residential offering diverse experiences, outdoor pursuits, teamwork and leadership skills.
- Continued running of holiday clubs promoting physical recreation.
- Quality and diverse PE/Sport lessons conducted by teaching staff with the use of the 'PE Hub' online resources.
- Use of the new MUGA (Multi Use Games Area) to encourage physical recreation at break/lunch times with the use of new sports equipment to enhance diversity and new skill acquisition.

Areas for further improvement and focus

- A much more progressive PE curriculum with assessment of key data to promote progress and attainment.
- Continue to offer alternative sports opportunities.
- Access to the swimming curriculum for all ages at Elm Tree.
- Encourage healthier packed lunches to improve better lifestyle choices for all pupils.
- Consider how we might introduce whole school activities like the 'Daily mile' and overcome the logistical issues of the school day/timetable.

- Healthy school meals and snack options at breakfast and break times.
- Diverse enrichment opportunities including horse riding, climbing, forest school
- Further CPD opportunities for those staff members delivering the PE curriculum/ activities during option time
- Introduction of intra school competitions to promote health/fitness/pupil involvement in physical recreation.
- Introduction Inter school sport
