

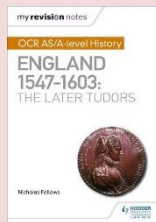

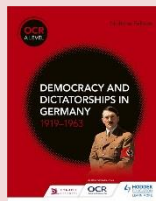
History Year 12	Module 1/2	Module 1/2	Module 3
Topic Theme and Intent	Students study Later Tudor England between 1547-1603 , exploring the reigns of Edward VI, Mary I and Elizabeth I . They will study the stability of the monarchy, religious change and the threat of unrest under the Protestant reign of Edward VI and the Catholic reign of Mary I. Students will then examine the reign of Elizabeth I in detail, including internal and external threats to her monarchy and the growing pressure from Mary Queen of Scots.	Students study Democracy to Dictatorship . Students will learn about the establishment and development of the Weimar Republic, Establishment of a Nazi Dictatorship with a key focus on Nazi policies. They will also examine the impact of War and Germany's defeat, and finally concentrate on Germany post WW2 with a key focus on divisions.	Students will complete independent study by completing a piece of coursework . Students will choose a question related to either Elizabeth I, Nazi Germany or Russia. Students will collect primary and secondary historical evidence in order to write this extended piece of work and make substantiated judgements. This will culminate with a 4000-word essay.

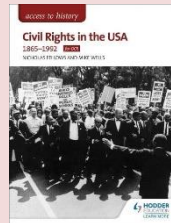

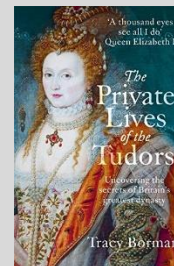

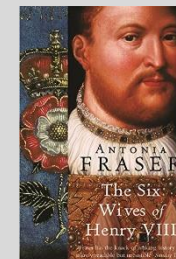
