Subject: RE

Spiritual

At Endeavour Academy the spiritual development of pupil's through RE is shown by their:

- ability to be reflective about their own beliefs, religious or otherwise, that inform their perspective on life and their interest in and respect for different people's faiths, feelings and values
- sense of enjoyment and fascination in learning about themselves, others and the world around them
- use of imagination and creativity in their learning
- willingness to reflect on their experiences
- developing sense of identity and belonging, preparing them for life as citizens in a plural society

Moral

At Endeavour Academy the moral development of pupil's through RE is shown by their:

- ability to recognise the difference between right and wrong and to readily apply this understanding in their own lives
- understanding of the consequences of their own and others behaviours and actions
- interest in investigating and offering reasoned views about moral and ethical issues and ability to understand and appreciate the viewpoints of others on these issues

Social

At Endeavour Academy the social development of pupil's through RE is shown by their:

- relations with others in the classroom and their willingness to work together co-operatively for example, working and socialising with other pupils, including those from different religious, ethnic and socio-economic backgrounds
- ability to resolve conflicts effectively
- recognising that not all people of faith are the same
- understanding of the consequences of personal choice and actions.

Cultural

At Endeavour Academy the cultural development of pupil's through RE is shown by their:

- understanding and appreciation of the wide range of cultural influences that have shaped their own heritage and those of others
- learning about other religions, giving pupils an opportunity to learn what it means to belong, to develop confidence in themselves and be able to respond positively to similarities and differences in our multi-faith and changing society
- understanding of a range of beliefs, practices and values in their own society and in the wider world.
- understanding of the cultural context within which they live.
