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
This week's learning is based around our new topic of '**Transport**' and we will be thinking about what fun we can have on trains. We will think about the different parts of train and imagine going on a train ride.

<p style="text-align: center;">Art</p> <p>Can you make your own train? What materials will you use? What colours? How will it move? How will you join the materials together?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Writing</p> <p>Draw a picture of a scene from a window of a journey on a train. Write labels of the things you have drawn.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Computing (Purple Mash)</p> <p>Steam Train - Create your own steam train. Train Driver -Put yourself into the role of a train driver. Show their thoughts and character in the speech bubble Train -Can you piece together this image of a train?</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Geography</p> <p>After watch The Train Ride, talk about the differences between the town, the countryside and the seaside environments that the girl sees on her journey.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Speaking and Listening</p> <p>Look at the pictures of the trains from around the world. Talk about the different and similarities you can see.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">History</p> <p>Use the internet to research how trains have changed. What is a steam train? How is it different to the trains we have today? Which would you rather travel on? Why?</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Writing</p> <p>To travel on a train you need to have a ticket. Have you ever had a ticket to travel on a train or bus? Can you use the sheet attached to write out your own train ticket?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Maths</p> <p>Look at the Shape train pictures. What 2D shapes can you see? What are these shapes called? Can you describe the properties of these 2D shapes? Can you use some 2D shapes to create your own shape train?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Physical Activity</p> <p>You are going to be train driver and ask some of your family to be the carriages. Walk around, sometimes changing speed and direction, with the rest of the 'train' copying your movements, speeds and actions. Other actions/movements could be used e.g. waving, skipping, jumping, hopping. Repeat this activity but ask someone else to be the driver.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Music</p> <p>Use an instruments or your body to make the rhythm of the train as it travels. A train doesn't always go at the same speed. Can you make the rhythm go slower or faster?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Outdoors</p> <p>Go on your own train ride either in your garden or on your daily exercise. Use your binoculars to say what you can see as you move along.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Cooking</p> <p>Can you use items you have in your fridge or cupboards to make a snack that looks like a train?</p>  

Nursery English and Phonics Home Learning

Monday 22nd June 2020

Day 1- Writing

Can you write your name? How many times can you write your name in a minute? In 2 minutes? Can you write it big, small? What about the other people in your house? What do their names begin with? Can you sound them out and write their names?

Monday's Phonics:

- Phonics Play = Flashcard challenge - Phase 2 = Can you recognise all the sounds?
- Introduce Z sound = Read words: zip, zap, zig-zag, zest
- Practice writing Z with correct formation
- Sound out & write: zip

Tuesday 23rd June 2020

Day 2- Reading

Watch & listen to the story: <https://youtu.be/iHbE8kaBDKU> = The Train Ride. What are the main events in the story? Where is the story set? Who are the main characters? Talk about the story = What did you like? What didn't you like? Why?

Tuesday's Phonics:

- Phonics Play = Buried Treasure = Phase 2 words or using Z sound introduced yesterday
- Write: zap, zut, zig, zog = Which is the real word?
- Look around your home = Can you find anything beginning with Z = Can you write a label for it?

Wednesday 24th June 2020

Day 3 Speaking and listening

Have you ever been on a train? Where did you go on the train? What colour was the train? What was it like on the train? Are all trains the same? What sounds do you hear on train? Can you make the sounds? What sound does a train make as it goes along the track? What other sounds might you hear?

Wednesday's Phonics:

- Phonics Play = Flashcard challenge - Phase 2 = Can you recognise all the sounds?
- Introduce ZZ sound = Read words: buzz, jazz, fizz, dazzle

- Practice writing ZZ with correct formation
- Sound out & write: puzzle

Thursday 25th June 2020

Day 4 - Writing

Re-listen to the story using the above YouTube link. What did they see on the train ride? Can you draw something that they saw? Can you write the initial sound for that word - What other sounds can you hear in that word? Can you write a simple caption e.g. I can see a...

Thursday's Phonics:

- Phonics Play = Buried Treasure = Phase 2 words or using ZZ sound introduced yesterday
- Write: dazzle, jazz, buzz
- Read & find the zz sound = It can fizz and buzz.
- Name writing

Friday 26th June 2020

Day 5- Writing

Look at the front cover of the book (found on Youtube link or on Google Images.) What vehicle is it? Can you draw a train? Consider the shapes needed and how you can position your train. Can you label the carriage? The front? The wheels? Can you write a simple captions e.g. A train..... to describe your train.

Friday's Phonics:

- Phonics Play = Flashcard challenge - Phase 2 = Can you recognise all the sounds?
- Introduce QU sound = Read words: quit, quiz, quick, quack
- Practice writing QU with correct formation
- Sound out & write: Quiz
- Read: I quit the quiz.

Nursery Maths Home Learning

This week, we will be focusing closely on a number the day. There will be activities each day to do and we would also like you to create a poster each day to show different ways to represent the number e.g. four flower or a car as it has four wheels.

Monday 22nd June 2020

- Can you write the number one?
- Can you draw Numberblock Number One?
- Can you find the number one on the television remote control?
- Can you find 1p in somebody's purse or wallet? What does it look like?
- Can you stand on one leg?
- Can you show one on your hand?
- Can you find objects around the house or outside that comes in one? e.g. one table.
- Create a number one poster.

Tuesday 23rd June 2020

- Can you write the number two?
- Can you draw Numberblock Number Two? Can you draw him in a different way?
- Can you find the number two on a clock?
- Can you find things that come in pairs?
- Can you find two cars on your street which are the same colour?
- Can you jump twice?
- Can you find a 2p coin in somebody's purse or wallet? What does it look like?
- Create a number two poster.

Wednesday 24th June 2020


- Can you write the number three?

- Create a number three poster.


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
- Can you write the number four?

- Create a number four poster.


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
- Can you write the number five?

- Create a number five poster.





















































