It has been proven that making music central to children's learning ensures they reap the benefits the artform can bring to personal growth. Here is a selection of fiction and non-fiction books focusing on music.




Readers age 7+

Discover the sorcery of perhaps the most famous opera of all, Mozart's 'The Magic Flute' in this retelling of the opera. Push the button on each beautiful scene to hear the vivid sound of an orchestra playing, and singers singing, from Mozart's score. This picture book tells the tale of a prince and a kidnapped princess, of a cheeky bird catcher, a warring king and queen, and of course a magic flute.

There's a short biography of Mozart on the final page to spark more interest in Mozart and his music and more information on the music, and what to listen out for. The illustrations are lively and full of detail. This is a thoroughly charming first introduction to opera.


