

What is Phonics?

- Skills of segmenting and blending
 - Knowledge of the alphabet
 - Decoding words and sentences
 - Tricky words
 - Little & often
 - Fun and quick paced
 - Active
 - A major link to reading



Letters & Sounds

- Each letter has
 - A letter name
- A letter sound (Phoneme)
- A way of writing the sound (grapheme)
 - A capital letter
 - A lowercase letter






Phonics Sessions

- 2x Daily Lessons 09:00 and 13:50 for around 15 minutes each.
 - Taught within classes
- Sessions are practical, interesting and follow the Floppy's Phonics schemes.
- Session 1: learning new sounds & practising use them in Floppy's Phonics games
 - Session 2 Practice & apply (Phonics Activity
 Sheets)



Phonics Scheme

- Lots of different Phonics Schemes Letters & Sounds, RWI, Floppy's Phonics
- We use Floppy's Phonics Linked to our reading scheme
- Linked to some of our Reading books. Children will have a book which practises the sounds from our Phonics lessons. Children will leave Reception on a stage 3 or stage 4 book.

- Stage 4 (ay,oy,ea,ie,ow,ew,ew,ou,ir,aw,eer,are,ce,ea,o,ed)
 - Currently in Recention we are working on stage 1+



Terminology

Phoneme

A phoneme is the smallest unit of sound in a word It is generally accepted that most varieties of spoken English use about 44 phonemes.

Graphemes

A grapheme is a symbol of a phoneme. It is a letter or group of letters representing a sound.

Segmenting and blending

Segmenting consists of breaking words down into phonemes to spell. Blending consists of building words from phonemes to read. Both skills are important.

Digraph

This is when two letters come together to make a phoneme. For example, /oa/ makes the sound in 'boat' and is also known as a **vowel digraph**. There are also **consonant digraphs**, for example, /sh/ and /ch/.

Trigraph


This is when three letters come together to make one phoneme, for example /igh/.


Split digraph


A digraph in which the two letters are not adjacent – e.g. make, fuse, cone,



Blending


 After segmenting sounds, children then put the sounds together to read the word e.g


- b-e-d = bed

- ch-ar-m = charm








Using phoneme frames – segmenting for spelling

 - <u>Review</u> Phonic Activity







How Reading Works at Endeavour Academy

- Every child has a reading book changed weekly (Children to bring in book every day)
- Read whenever opportunity arises can be more than once a week
 - Focus on children trying to segment/blend words independently
- Tricky words Introduced weekly & children encouraged to apply in writing.
 - Lots of discussion/questioning about the book afterwards comprehension skills
- All children start on Stage 1+ books and progress through Stage 3/4 target for end of Reception
 - Children should be reading as much as possible at home write a comment in your child's Yellow Reading Record
 - Key words



Reading & Writing


- Reading is the first step into writing
- As children begin to recognise/learn letter sounds,
 we encourage them to use them in their writing
 - 1 guided write every week
 - At least 1 independent write every week
 - Letter formation practice
 - Any writing from home always welcome




How You Can Help at

Home?


- Read with your child as much as possible
- Letter recognition
- Encourage reading & writing when and where possible
- Use the apps/games online e.g. Phonics play
- Correct pronunciation is key e.g. sss not suh
- Use terminology to help the children get used to it.



Phonics Screen



- June 2024 (Summer term Year 1)
- Assesses how well children can use and apply their
 Phonics skills
- Children to decode 40 words Mixture of real and pseudo (alien) words.
 - Conducted in a quiet room in the school.
- Support will be given in Year 1 to all children to help them reach the National standard.
 - More information will come in Year 1
