



Key Stage 1 - Easter Holidays Activities

Make a money box



What you will need: paper, pencil, cardboard (old boxes, cereal boxes, card etc), kitchen towel rolls, scissors, glue/sellotape, any decorating material available (e.g paint, paper, felt tips, collage materials)

Parents: Explain to your child that they are going to make a money box.

First, they need to design the money box. Let them draw money box before they start building. They will have to decide how to create a flap through which the money box can be opened. It is a nice idea to let your child explain what they have designed.


Second, let the child build their design. decide how to create a flap through which the money box can be opened. Please supervise your child if they are cutting.

Third, once they have finished ask them what they like or dislike about the end result and what they could improve.

Tips: If they're using cereal boxes, turn them inside out if they want to paint them, that way the paint will stick.

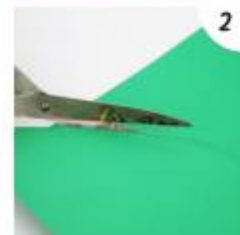
Easter Morning Handprint Scene

Supplies

- Blue, green, white and brown paper or card
- Yellow paint
- Paint brush
- Scissors
- Glue stick



1 Using yellow paint, print a hand print onto the white paper, then leave to dry.



2 Lay the green paper down so that it is portrait, then draw a hill shape onto it which takes up the width of the card. Cut the hill shape out.



3 Draw either one or three cross shapes onto brown card, then cut them out.



4 Cut out the hand print and position it on the blue paper so that it will stick out slightly from the green hill, then stick it onto the blue paper.



5 Stick the green hill onto the blue paper, so that the hand print peeps out from behind it.



6 Stick the cross or crosses onto the top of the hill, then leave to dry.
