Captain Tom Moore

Captain Tom Moore is famous around the world because of all the money he has raised for the National Health Service (NHS).

Who Is Captain Tom Moore?

Captain Tom is an ex-soldier from Bedfordshire. He was born in Yorkshire and when he was younger, he was in the army and even fought in the Second World War.



Raising Money

Captain Tom decided to raise money for the NHS to say thank you to them. He spent some time in hospital a few years ago when he had a hip operation. He set himself the challenge of walking 100 laps around his garden before his 100th birthday on 30th April 2020.

Why Is He Famous?

Captain Tom set himself a target of £1000, but he reached this in one day. As word quickly spread about what he was doing, people around the world decided to donate money.

So far, he has raised over 27 million pounds!

Captain Tom, who walks with a walking frame, reached 100 laps two weeks before his 100th birthday. Soldiers formed a guard of honour for his last few laps.

Science

Rain Cloud in a Jar

You will need:



Shaving cream



A clear large jar



Water



Blue food colouring



Pipettes or eyedropper



Small bowl


Method:

1. Fill the large jar with water, leaving 2 inches at the top.
2. Add the shaving cream to the top of the water until it reaches the top of the jar.
3. Next, add 1 cup of water to the small bowl and 3 drops of blue food colouring.
4. Mix the water and food colouring together.
5. Use the pipette to add drops of the water mixture to the top of the shaving cream cloud.
6. Continue adding the water mixture until you begin to notice the raindrops begin to break through the bottom of the cloud.


My Family Crest



Eid Moon and Star Mobile

You will need:

- Moon and Star Template
- PVA glue
- Gold glitter
- String or ribbon
- Lolly stick
- Scissors
- Tape



Instructions

1. Carefully cut out the moon and star shapes.
2. Spread glue onto the shapes and cover in gold glitter.
3. Sprinkle gold glitter all over the shapes.
4. Tape the shapes onto a piece of string, putting the tape on the reverse side.
5. Repeat with another piece of string.
6. Tie the ends of the pieces of string to opposite ends of a lolly stick.
7. Finally, tie a longer piece of string to the lolly stick to hang the mobile up.
