


## Going Deeper Questions

Which giraffe is the tallest? Which one giraffe is the shortest? How do you know? How could you check? Is there anything you could use?





## Going Deeper Questions

What does full mean? What does empty mean? How much of the glass do you need to colour to show that it is nearly empty? Is there more than one way to show nearly empty? What would a glass that is nearly full look like? Is there more than one way to show this?

Would a full bucket have more or less sand than the bucket in the middle? Would an empty bucket have more or less sand than the bucket in the middle? Do all the buckets need to be the same size? How could you be sure a bucket had more sand in it? (Make it full) How could you be sure a bucket has less sand? (Make it empty).
