Congratulations to the Year 11 leavers of 2025.



We are proud to share that the summer 2025 GCSE results were record breaking. Our highest ever Attainment 8 score of 54.11 up from 48.10 in 2024, the nation average was 45.9. The pass rate for students achieving grade 4 or above in both English and Maths was 84.8% (*64.5%), with 63.8% (*45.2%) achieving grade 5 and above in both subjects last year. 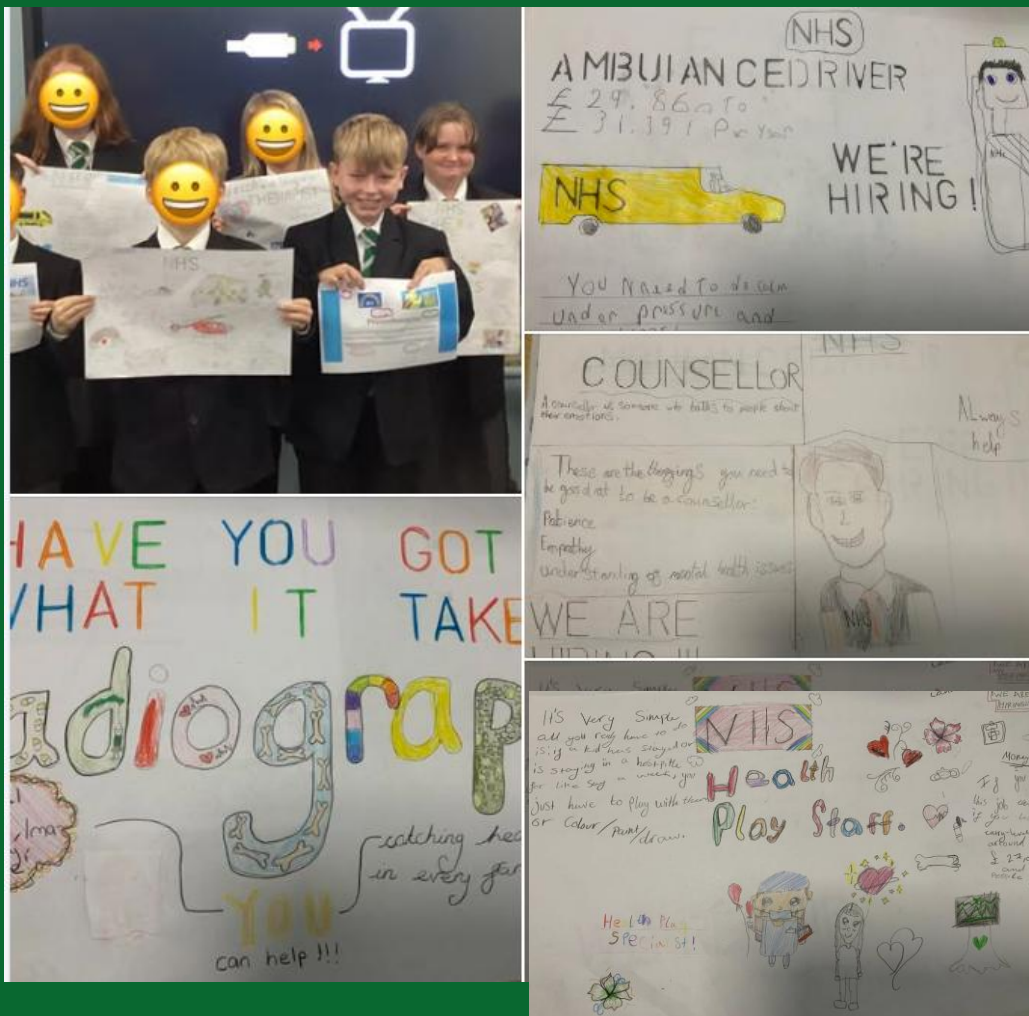


A focus on CAREERS

Year 9 have taken part in an Engineering ‘Critical Load Challenge’ led by Liam from The Inspirational Learning Group. Students explored the concepts of structural engineering and how to measure the critical load, or the maximum weight a structure can bear. Students learnt about basic structures, how to reinforce them for strength, how to select materials, and teamwork. Students designed and built a prototype structure to hold increasingly greater weights. Well done to all pupils and especially 9 Spode who were the overall winners

Prosthetic technician

Prosthetic technicians give the gift of artificial replacements (prosthetics) to patients missing an arm or leg.

Prosthetists or orthotists improve people's mobility and help them be as pain-free as possible by using aids and creating and fitting limb replacements

The roles of a prosthetist and orthotist are similar, however the way that they help patients differs.

Prosthetists - create and fit prostheses or aids for people of all ages requiring artificial limb replacements. This includes those who have been born with a limb defect or missing limb (congenital absence), those who have lost a limb through trauma, or those who have had limb amputation due to infection or long-term health conditions

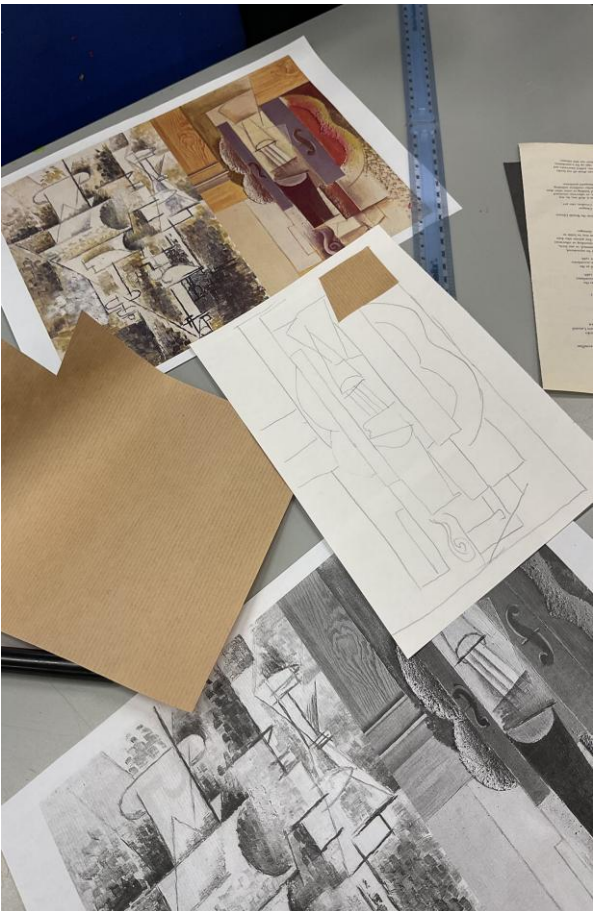

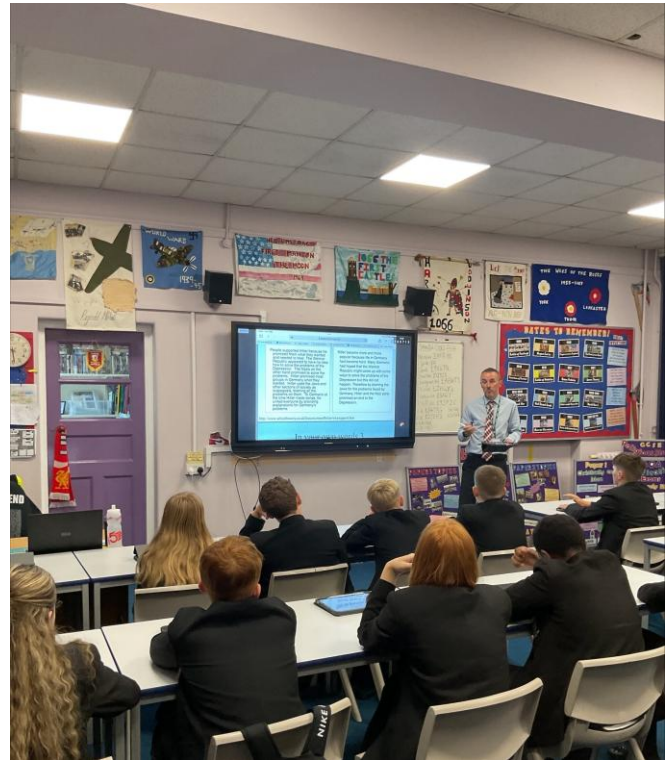

LEARNING FOR LIFE

In L4L all pupils in all years have had a session about ethical writing including discussions on own work verses others, plagiarism and paraphrasing and thinking for ourselves. Some groups have had amazing discussions about the use of AI in the world and also whether it has made us smarter or not. Well done everyone.



As part of our continued commitment to enrich pupils in the Learning for Life programme we have had a wonderful guest speaker in called Liv Robinson who inspired our Year 9 pupils. She spoke about setting herself a target (walking the length of the UK) and what this has done for her. She talked to the pupils about how she experienced our core values of determination, curiosity and kindness whilst doing her adventure and what it taught her about herself and others along the way. She also talked about resilience, tenacity and her mental and physical health. The pupils engaged with her and asked many questions. Well done Year 9 and well done Liv on your inspiring story.



Year 11s have had L4L sessions by Tom Martin our Mental health practitioner. He has done group sessions on stress and anxiety in readiness to help them moving into assessment windows. He has talked with them about signs and signals , coping strategies and understanding the psychology of the stress buckets. Pupils have been well engaged , asked questions and all have some reflection time for themselves too. All the year group have had some quality Tom time talking about these really important issues.



Year 7 had an external L4L assembly today that talked about all sorts of challenging issues. The drama production helped pupils to see about some risks and how to deal with them. Well done Year 7 for your engagement and focus.



Year 11 had an assembly with Tom Martin to help talk about resilience and taking on responsibility for their own resilience over the next few months. Pupils listened well and hopefully they have talked about ways they can improve their own mental health and resilience levels.

Thank you, Tom, for a great assembly and helping our children think differently.



As part of our continued commitment to the learning for life programme, the education officer from Staffordshire highways came to speak to some of our pupils about road safety. He talked to them about the importance of not being distracted, being seen and also risk taking behaviours. We hope this has helped the pupils appreciate how to be even safer on the roads and on the footpaths whether they are cycling or walking. Well done to all involved.

Please can all parents and carers continue to have a chat with their children about how to be safe and be seen (especially in these darker nights) and also remind how to be safe around the roads.



L4L assembly was run by Staffordshire young carers helping pupils to understand what a young carer is and what role they have. It also helped the pupils to appreciate the feelings of young carers and effects of being a young carer. They gained knowledge and understanding about the referral process. Pupils were able to ask questions and gain more insights into this.



A representative from the Odd balls foundation came into school to speak to all our year 10 students about the importance of self examinations and knowing your own body. Zoe our speaker said our pupils were really well behaved and engaged in the session. The session gave some background about the foundation, understanding what cancer is and also the need for being aware of our own bodies and how to seek help.

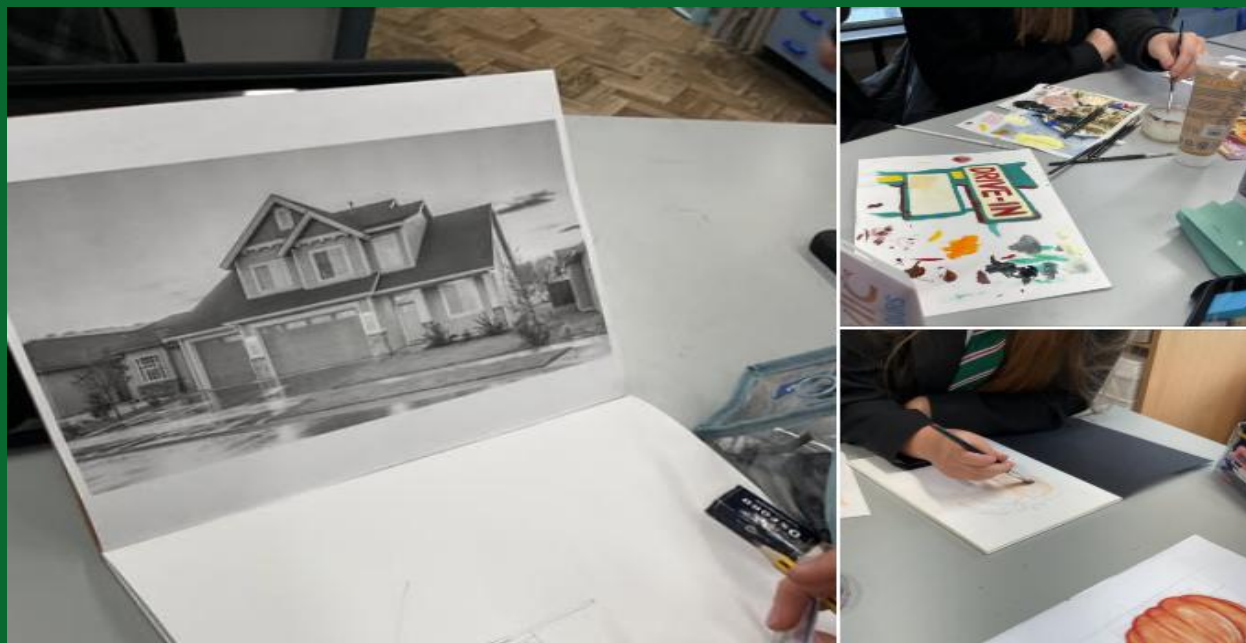



This is a remarkable achievement, especially given the huge field of competitors in her age category.

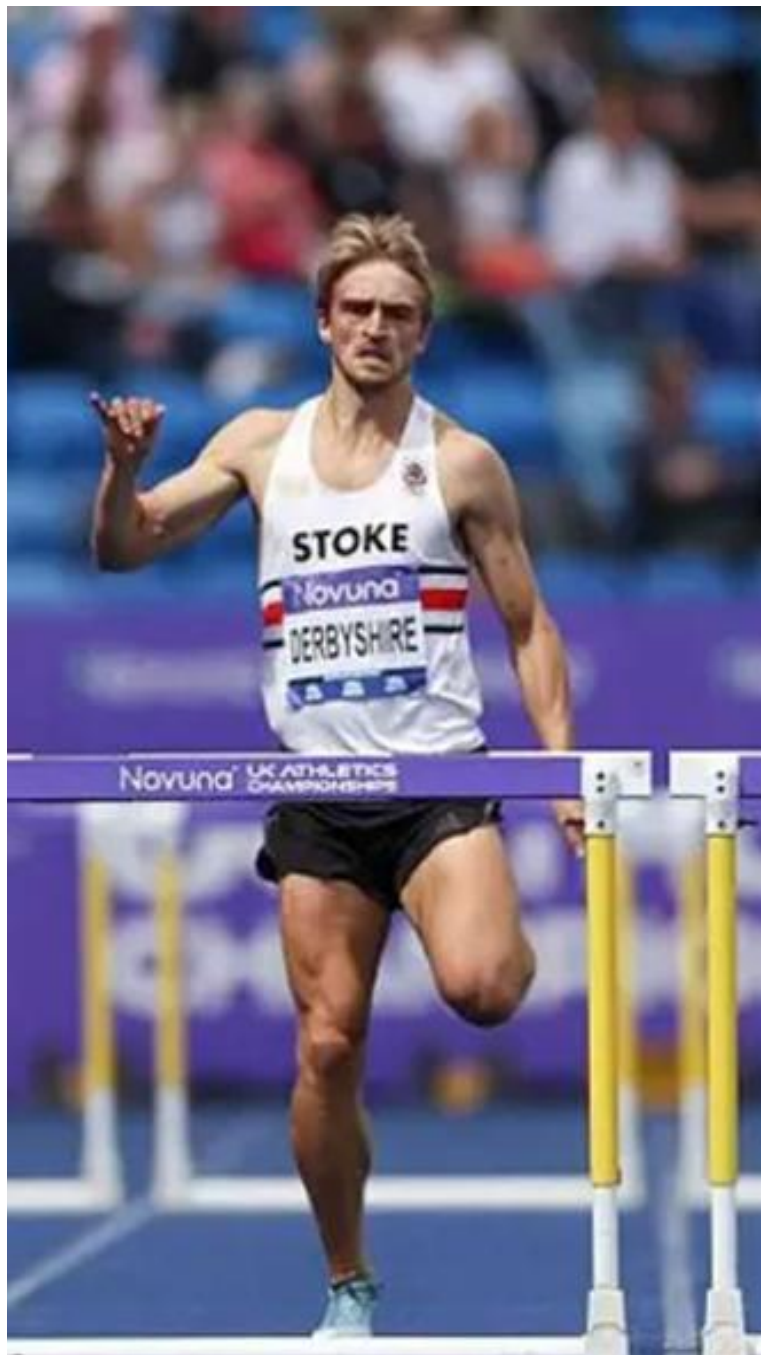

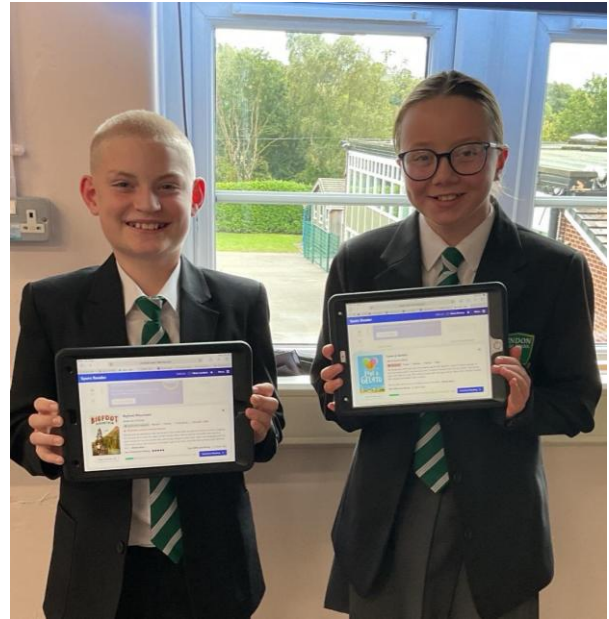

It's not always easy to talk about feelings, emotions and our own mental health but the more we normalise it the easier it can become.

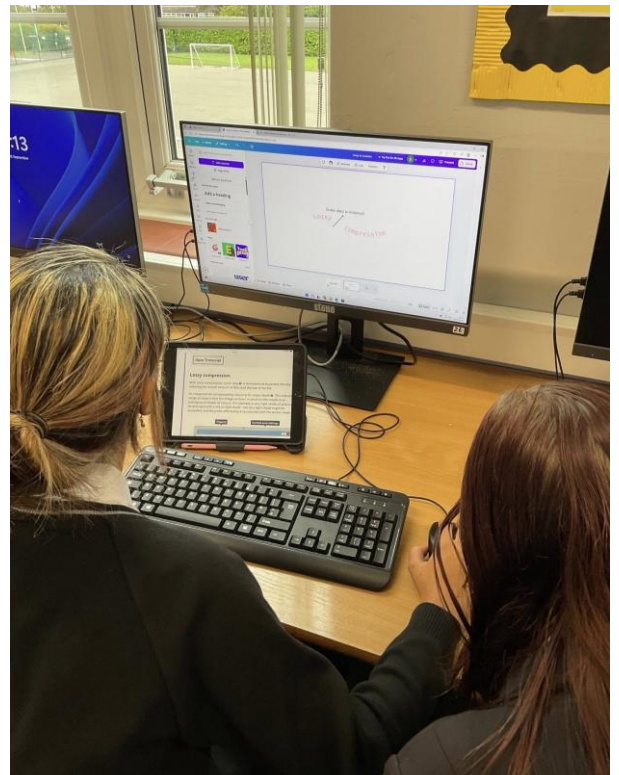
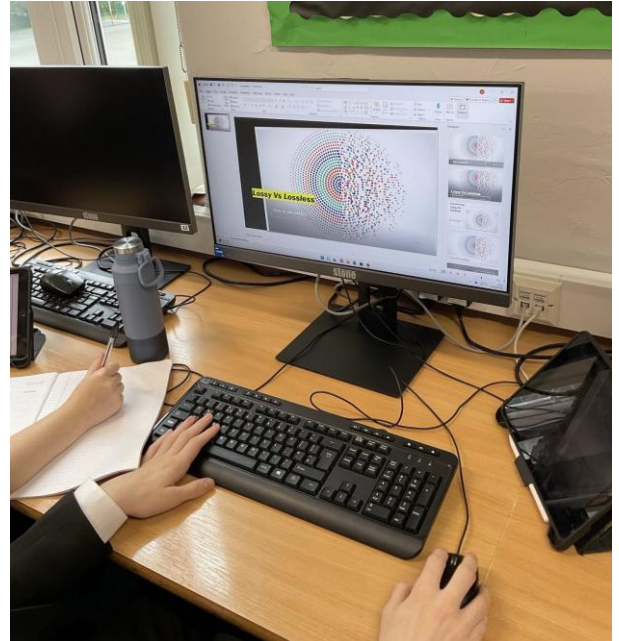
My Support Circle

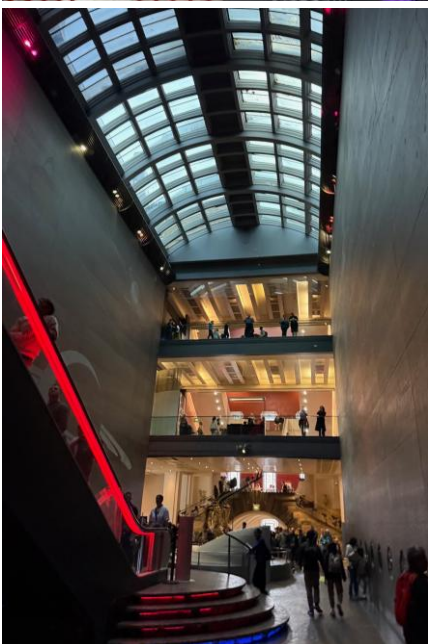


THE ARTS LONDON VISIT
