Anglo-Saxon and the Vikings

The children are learning about life in England at the end of the 4th century and how the fall of the Roman Empire affected the country. They will explore why the Angles, Saxons, and Jutes came to Britain and how Anglo-Saxon kingdoms were ruled and controlled. The children will learn about changes in power and religion during this time, as well as who the Vikings were, where they settled, and who was in charge in England when they arrived.

Music

Musical Effects and Moods

Children will explore how different musical sounds can create effects and express moods. They use their voices and instruments creatively, changing elements like pitch, dynamics and timbre to make music feel happy, calm, tense or exciting. They learn how composers use harmony and sound choices to build atmosphere and convey emotion. Children also listen carefully, improvise their own musical ideas, and think about how music makes them feel, helping them understand and use mood and expression in their own performances.

PE

OAA

Children take part in challenges that require cooperation, communication and problem-solving. They learn how to plan strategies as a team, navigate using maps and basic orienteering skills, show leadership, build trust, and reflect on their performance to improve. These activities help children develop resilience, responsibility and respect for others while working towards shared goals.

Dance

Children explore movement creatively, developing their ability to compose, perform and evaluate dance sequences. They learn to use rhythm, timing, expression and space effectively, often responding to different themes, stimuli or music. Pupils refine their control, coordination and performance quality, and gain confidence performing both individually and as part of a group.

Science

Light

In this unit, we will learn light travels in straight lines from a source, such as the Sun or a lamp. Light can reflect off surfaces, pass through some materials, or be absorbed. We see objects when light travels into our eyes, either directly from a light source or after bouncing off an object. We will use light ray diagrams to show how light moves from a source to the eye. We will learn that shadows are formed when an object blocks light, and because light travels in straight lines, the shadow is the same shape as the object.

Computer science

Children learn to become confident and responsible users of technology. They explore coding and programming to create simple games or programs, understanding how to use algorithms and sequences to make things happen on a computer. They also learn to safely search for, evaluate, and use information online, and understand how digital systems work. These skills help them solve problems, think logically, and use technology creatively.

Healthy Me

Children learn to take personal responsibility for their choices and actions. They explore how different substances can affect the body, understand the dangers of exploitation like 'county lines' and gang culture, and learn ways to look after their emotional and mental health. They also develop strategies to manage stress and stay resilient.
