

<h2>Science</h2> <h3>Living Things and their Habitats</h3> <p>This term in science, the children will learn to explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead, and those that have never been alive. They will investigate how animals and plants are suited to their habitats, naming a variety of species and understanding how habitats provide for their basic needs. Finally, they will study simple food chains to see how animals obtain food from plants and other animals, identifying different sources of food and how living things depend on each other.</p>	<h2>History</h2> <h3>Where did Kings and Queens live throughout History?</h3> <p>This term in history, the children will discover why monarchs built castles and learn about Britain's Kings and Queens of the past. They will find out who Queen Victoria was, where she lived, and learn about the first Queen Elizabeth. They will also explore why King William I is important and how royal homes have changed through time.</p>	<h2>Music</h2> <h3>Performing rhythms and movement to a steady pulse</h3> <p>This term, the children will learn how songs and music can communicate different moods and emotions. They will investigate different ways to express the mood of a song by adding facial expressions and changing the timbre and dynamics of their voice. They will develop their understanding of musical mood through simple songs, where they will be introduced to major and minor tonality.</p>
<h2>PE</h2> <h3>Fitness/Dance &amp; Gymnastics</h3> <p>This term children will continue with their Fitness unit from last term and then move onto Dance.
