## **NEW to Home Learning soon...**

In the older classes, we have been undertaking a trial, where the class teacher sets up a Microsoft Teams meeting for the children on site and those learning from home each week, so that the class can be together.

These meetings have been relatively successful, now that the initial technical issues have been resolved and rules have been set up to ensure we can safeguard the children online to keep them safe.

We are hoping to roll this out with all classes within the next week or so, which means that all of the children across all of the classes will have the opportunity to join a meeting to speak / listen to friends / teachers in each class. The younger children will clearly need some help with this – and maybe adults too! You will be provided with a guide to help you set up 'Teams' for your child, if you have not undertaken this before, so do not panic! We are in the process of preparing for this next step, so please bear with us – individual emails need to be set up for every child and timings need to vary across the school to avoid a system overload.

The impact of this on the older children has been very positive for their well-being – the children regain motivation for learning and show a joy for being able to keep in touch. Watch this space!!
