In this video we look at one of the most popular activities where I discuss what types of content is most popular with children and some of the risks and issues. YouTube was originally designed for persons 13 years and over. If you're not aware there is another version of YouTube which is specifically for younger children, called YouTube Kids. I like YouTube Kids, there are some great parental controls that can be used. However, the content on YouTube Kids is for very young children, so it's not a surprise to see younger children using the main YouTube service.
