Maths

In Robin Class, we follow the White Rose Maths scheme of learning. This is also supported by our use of the NCETM curriculum for further embedding.

In Spring 2, we will be focusing on the following key areas of learning.

- Growing 6, 7, 8.
- · Focusing on doubling to 8.
- · Focusing on one more and one less
- Combining two groups.
- Recognise and name 3D shapes.
- Identify more complex patterns

Expressive Arts and Design

The children will be creating their own 3D farm using recycled materials and working collaboratively. We will be discussing our creations, evaluating and planning carefully.

The children will be exploring different medias and materials and medias considering which material would work best and when.

Physical Development

In our PE classes this half term, the children will develop their fundamental movement skills through the topic of 'On the Farm'. Fundamental skills will include balancing, running, changing direction, jumping, hopping and travelling. Children will develop gross motor skills through a range of activities. They will learn how to stay safe using space, follow rules and instructions and work independently and with a partner.

In our continuous provision activities we will continue to promote fine motor skills, as well as conducting specific activities such as Funky Fingers and Dough Disco to develop muscular strength and fine motor skills.

Communication and Language

We aim to develop communication and language through all of the learning which takes place in Robin Class. By utilising continuous provision areas such as Role Play and Small World.

We also aim to develop communication and language skills through more focused activities such as literacy and PSED. Some of the ways in which we practice this is by:

- Telling and retelling simple stories. In Robin Class we love to retell
 traditional tales and will read different versions of the same story. We
 will consider the similarities and differences between them and will retell
 them using puppets, story spoons and re-enactment. Our aim is that
 children leave EYFS with a bank of stories which they know and can
 verbally retell. We have a dedicated traditional tales area in the
 classroom which enables children to re-enact the traditional tale we are
 focusing on.
- We will be introducing 'drawing club' where we will expand the children's vocabulary, and develop their imaginations.

We will be creating new 'moments' for writing and conversations in our 'message centre'.

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

During this topic we will explore our rural community, as well as looking at the role of the 'farmer'. We will be exploring how we get our food. The children will have the opportunity to speak to local farmers as well as visit a local farm.

The children will learn about animals and how we look after them, they will recognise what their community looks like through map work and local walks.
