
Throughout the school children follow a Relationship and Sex Education Program 'A Journey in Love.' It is approved by the Archdiocese and Bishops.








Children's University

Children's University is a charity that works in partnership with schools to develop a love of learning in children. This is achieved by encouraging and celebrating participation in extracurricular activities in and outside of school.

- Passports available from the office £4
- One credit is awarded for one hour of activity (from clubs that are validated by CU) with a
 maximum of ten credits per term per activity
- Credits from clubs in school are recorded by school (not in passport)
- Half termly activities are sent out to parentsphotos showing evidence of completion of tasks sent to CU and credits are awarded.
- Graduation takes place in Year 2 and Year 6-Graduation Ceremony at Edge Hill.
- Credits can be achieved from residentials,
 Summer Reading Challenges and visiting particular museums.
