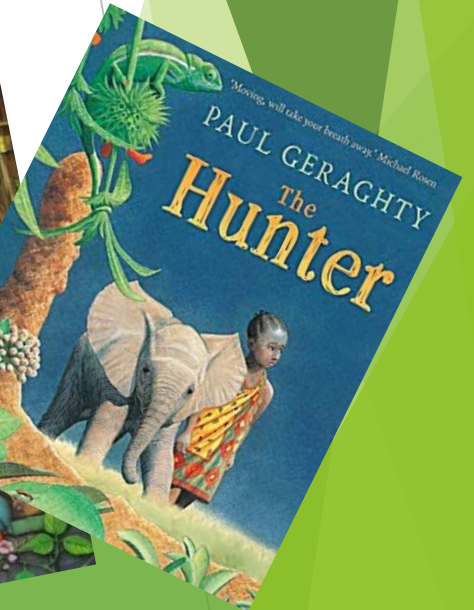
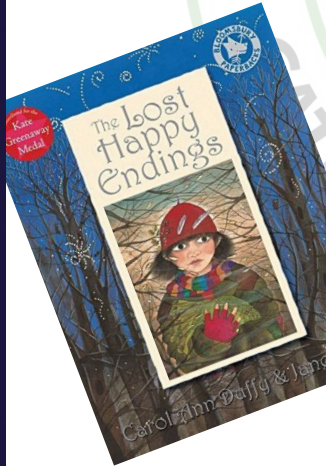
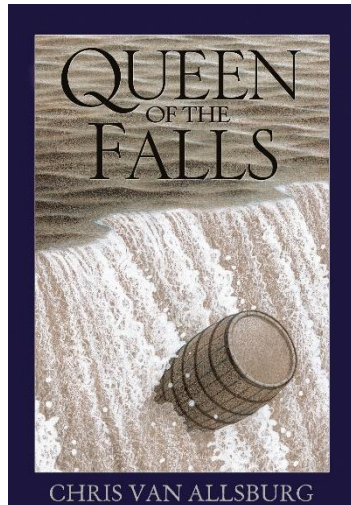

on standardized tests

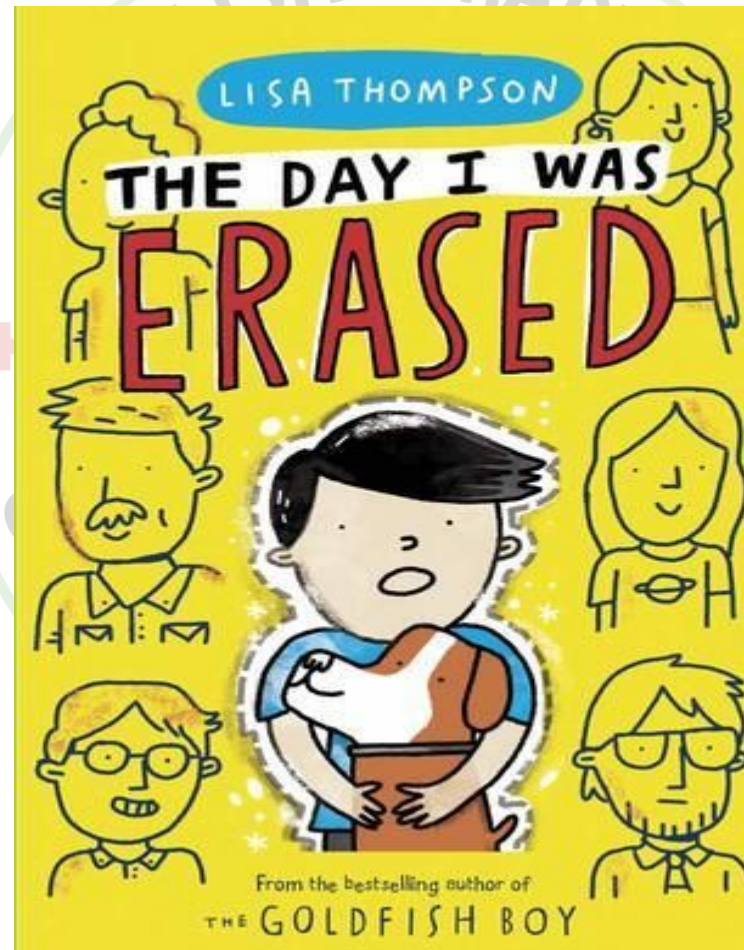

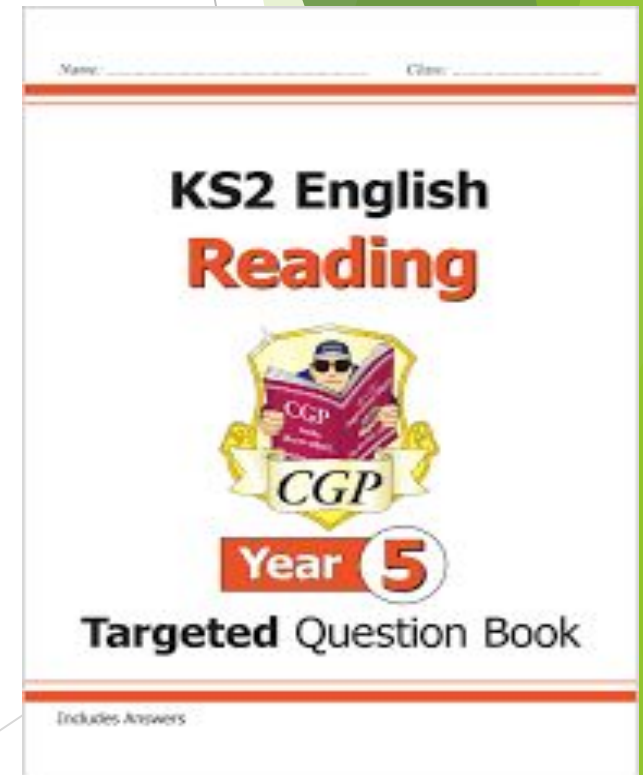


Class 'End of the Day' Reading Books

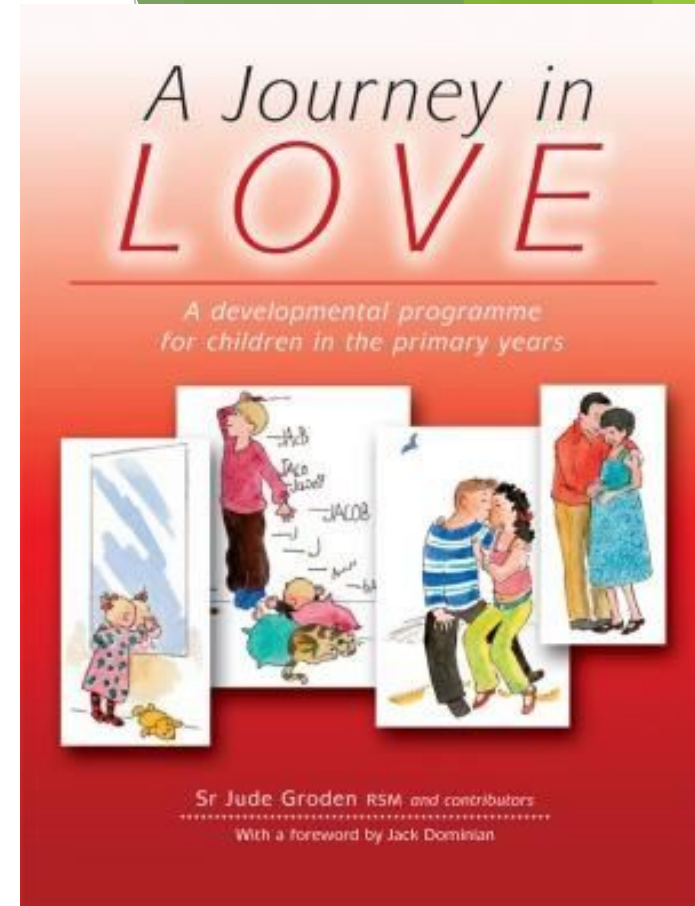
RSE

- Social

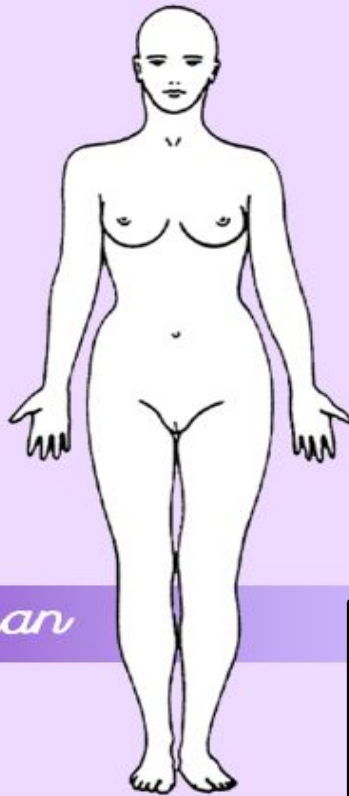
It is usually taught throughout the year and also where it fits in with science topics

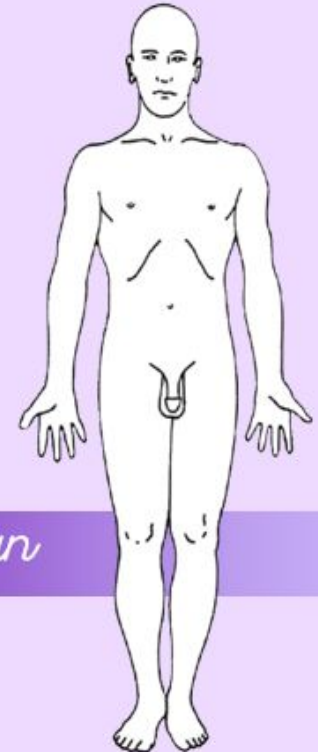

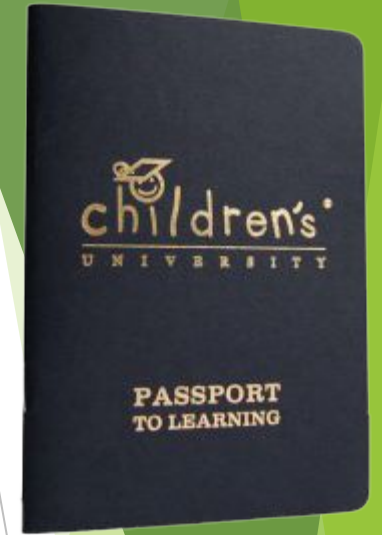

Children's University

Children's University is a charity that works in partnership with schools to develop a love of learning in children. This is achieved by encouraging and celebrating participation in extracurricular activities in and outside of school.

- ▶ Passports available from the office - £4
- ▶ One credit is awarded for one hour of activity (from clubs that are validated by CU) - with a maximum of ten credits per term per activity
- ▶ Credits from clubs in school are recorded by school (not in passport)
- ▶ Half termly activities are sent out to parents- photos showing evidence of completion of tasks sent to CU and credits are awarded.
- ▶ Graduation takes place in Year 2 and Year 6- Graduation Ceremony at Edge Hill.
- ▶ Credits can be achieved from residentials, Summer Reading Challenges and visiting particular museums.
