



Road Safety Week

Safe vehicles, safe lives!

This year, we are taking part in Road Safety Week. We're raising awareness of the devastating impact of road crashes on everyone involved and shouting out about some of the amazing ways that safe vehicles can stop road crashes and prevent road harm.

In Early Years, we will run a Beep Beep! Day using Brake resources to teach road safety basics to young children, including how child seats keep them safe when travelling by car.

In school we will talk about safe vehicles in class using the Brake Charity fun films and factsheets. The children will learn about cycling safely, on safe roads away from traffic.
