



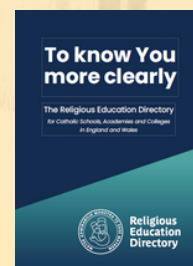

Dear Parents and Carers,

Children from Nursery to Year Four are learning from an updated Religious Education Curriculum. Starting from scripture, the children work on the same themes at an age and stage-appropriate level. Topics are longer, lasting for half a term each rather than four weeks. Children in Years 5 and 6 change to the new curriculum at a later date and are following the Come and See Programme of Study in the meantime.



Creation and Covenant

Nursery-Year 4

*3rd September -
24th October*

Children will listen to stories from the Bible on the theme of creation. They will learn about the sacrament of Baptism. We will talk about how God made everything in our world and how we can look after it.

Home Activities:



Encourage your child to take notice of the world around them. Talk about a family Baptism you have been to. If possible look at photographs of your child's Baptism.

Prophecy and Promise

Nursery-Year 4

3rd November - 19th December



Children will listen to St. Luke's Gospel and learn that Advent is a time to prepare for the birth of Jesus. They will learn about how this speaks to Christians today as they wait for Christ. Pupils will encounter the story of the nativity of Jesus and the mystery of the incarnation.

Home Activities:



Thank God for one thing each day during Advent. Write down your child's ideas and put them in a jar/box. Re-read them at Christmas to help us appreciate all we have to thank God for.

In school, we will celebrate Harvest Festival on the week beginning **13th October**. Nursery -Year 2 classes will have their own celebrations in school. Years 3 -6 will take part in a Harvest Service in church on **Wednesday 15th October at 2.30pm**. **All are welcome to attend!**

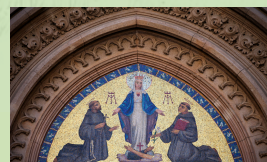
Important Dates This Term:

Advent means 'coming'. We think of the coming of Jesus when he was born but we also think of his promise that he would come again at the end of time. It is a time of waiting and preparing. It is only in the last week of Advent that we focus upon the events to be celebrated at Christmas.

The Immaculate Conception of The Blessed Virgin Mary

This feast marks the first stage of the existence of Mary, the mother of Jesus. She was 'full of grace' from the very beginning and co-operated with God throughout her life.
