Reading

- Children read everyday in school
- All children to have a reading record which is to be filled in by parents and junior children
- Oxford Owl Log in attached to the inside cover RWI book and quiz set each Friday plus access to other online books
- Children to take home two reading books a week -
 - Children still on the Read Write Inc (RWI) Phonics programme:
 - One RWI book chosen by the teacher and changed on a Friday
 - One Reading for Pleasure book chosen by the child from the class and changed when finished with
 - Children no longer on the RWI Phonics programme:
 - One Reading for Pleasure book chosen by and changed with the teacher
 - A second Reading for Pleasure book chosen by the child from the class reading corner and changed when finished with
- Children should be reading at least 5 times a week at home to build stamina and fluency when reading
- Children in Years Nursery-Y4 <u>MUST</u> have a school reading book bag

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





Children's University

Children's University is a charity that works in partnership with schools to develop a love of learning in children. This is achieved by encouraging and celebrating participation in extra-curricular activities in and outside of school.

- Passports available from the office £4
- One credit is awarded for one hour of activity (from clubs that are validated by CU)
 with a maximum of ten credits per term per activity
- Credits from clubs in school are recorded by school (not in passport)
- Half termly activities are sent out to parents- photos showing evidence of completion of tasks sent to CU and credits are awarded
- Graduation takes place in Year 2 and Year 6- Graduation Ceremony at Edge Hill
