Children will have the opportunity to participate in small group, class and one-to-one discussions, offering their own ideas. Children will be supported to engage in conversations with their teacher and peers, offering explanations for why things might happen and making use of recently introduced vocabulary from stories.								
Physical Developme nt	During Reception, children will explore the development of their gross motor skills. The children will have the opportunity to show their ability to negotiate space and obstacles safely, demonstrate strength, balance and coordination when playing and move energetically, such as running, jumping, dancing, hopping, skipping and climbing.  The children will also explore the development of their fine motor skills. By the end of Reception, children are expected to hold a pencil effectively in preparation for fluent writing – using the tripod grip in almost all cases, showing accuracy and care when drawing. Children will also have the opportunity to use a range of small tools, including scissors, paintbrushes and cutlery.
