

Exciting Playground Renovations

We recently received some fantastic news that our school has been awarded £100,000 from the council funds related to the sale of St Wilf's land. The funding is to be used to renovate and develop our outdoor and playground space. We have invited 2 companies to draw up plans and quote for this project and our School Councillors have met with one this week to discuss the suggested plans. This afternoon Mr Dinsdale met with all the School Councillors to vote on the company which has produced the better plans and utilised the funding to its maximum. The children were very excited about the plans submitted by Playsound Services Ltd. The School Councillors will continue to work with the appointed company to finalise the plans based on ideas from all our pupils. It is hoped that the works will take place over the next couple of months and be completed before the end of the summer holidays at the latest.

World Gifts Advent

During Advent we turn our attention to our neighbours around the world. Each year we support <u>CAFOD's World Gifts</u> <u>Campaign</u>. We are inviting each class in school to fundraise to buy the gift of a goat. Each goat costs £28. So from Monday we are asking children to bring 50pence to contribute to our goat totalisers in class! Case study: Goats bringing hope in Bangladesh

"I believe that one day I will be free from suffering." Rubina, Bangladesh

Rubina is 38 years old and lives with her husband and daughter in Bangladesh. Her husband is disabled and unable to work. Rubina's family rely solely on her income. In the past, they had no land to grow food on and Rubina was forced to beg for money to buy food. Thanks to support from CAFOD, Rubina and her family have received a nanny goat, goat feed, and training on how to care for their goat. With baby goats on the way, Rubina should have plenty of goats to keep or sell as she chooses. In addition, she can sell any excess milk at the local market to help provide a steady income.

Goats are the perfect livestock for many families living in rural areas. They are relatively easy to look after and can provide up to 12 pints of nutritious milk a week. As Rubina has discovered, they also breed quickly. As well as her goats, Rubina is expecting to be granted access to some nearby land to grow vegetables on.

The best safety feature that a child has is their parent or carer. Take the time to talk to your child about the apps and games they are using and don't be afraid to say no sometimes!
