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Mental Health Week

"Know Yourself, Grow Yourself" is this year's focus and is all about how we can build and grow our resilience by understanding ourselves and recognising our emotions. By understanding who we are, we can find out what makes us feel happy, or sad, or anxious, or scared - or maybe all of them at once!

As a school we are committed to supporting the emotional health and wellbeing of all pupils. We work closely with Sefton's Mental Health Support Team and encourage our pupils to talk freely about their emotions. This week all year groups have been exploring the theme "Know Yourself, Grow Yourself" as part of our ongoing commitment to helping children develop their understanding of themselves.

Encouraging and guiding a child to think about their own mental health and wellbeing are vital skills you can teach them from a young age. Talking to your child about how they're feeling can be tough, especially if you're concerned that they're having a hard time. You might not know what to say, or feel worried about how your child will react.

It doesn't matter what topic the conversation starts with – it's about the opportunity it gives you to talk about feelings and provide comfort. Whilst the activity is underway, what's the best way to encourage your child to open up?

How we celebrate Mental Health Week

In reception we do a lot of mindful breathing and mindful looking. The children practice several times a day, usually at transition times to settle themselves and get ready for learning. We are also doing Yoga/mindful movement once a week with Active Sefton.









For mental health week Y2 completed the I can and I would like to learn activity. They wrote their strengths and what they would like to be better at and hung them on our tree.





This week Year 4 have added more movement breaks into our day to improve our mental health and reduce the impact of sedentary lifestyle. We are also giving the children the responsibility of taking care of their own table plant.

Active school runs also help to reduce congestion and air pollution outside the school gate. A **2021 YouGov study** showed nearly half of UK children worry about air pollution near their school. And that children thought active travel was the best away to bring down these pollution levels. Plus, there are some great prizes to be won every day if we get enough children taking part!
