Cloakrooms & Back packs:

Lots of children are bringing large bags or backpacks into school and we have very limited space in the cloakrooms. When children hang these bags/ backpacks on their pegs, coats aren't able to fit securely and are falling to the floor. Bags/ backpacks are also having to be left on the floor and these then become a trip hazard for children and staff. Your child's safety is of utmost importance to us.









We politely ask that children in Reception to Y4 use the school book bag and a small lunch bag (examples pictured below). It is important that school reading books are kept separate from lunches and water bottles as books are getting spoiled and these are expensive to replace. Years 5 and 6 may continue to use backpacks and bags but we request that these are of an appropriate size (example below). Many thanks for your support.
