Accessibility Plan 2023/24

Purpose of Plan:

The purpose of this plan is to demonstrate how English Martyrs Catholic Primary School intends, over time, to increase the accessibility of our school for disabled pupils, staff, parents/carers and visitors.

Definition of Disability:

A person has a disability if he or she has a physical or mental impairment that has a substantial and long term adverse effect on his or her ability to carry out normal day to day activities.

Areas of Responsibilities:

- Improving access to the physical environment of school to increase the extent to which disabled pupils can take advantage of education and associated services, which includes improvements to the physical environment of the school and physical aids to access education.
- Increasing access for disabled pupils to the school curriculum, which includes teaching and learning and the wider curriculum of the school, such as participation in after school clubs, leisure and cultural activities or school visits.
- Improving the delivery of written information to disabled pupils, which is provided in writing to pupils who are not disabled, e.g. handouts, timetables, textbooks and information about school events. The information should take account of the pupils' disabilities and the preferred format of pupils and parents, and be made available within a reasonable timeframe.

English Martyrs Catholic Primary School aims to treat all pupils, prospective pupils, staff, governors and other stakeholders favourably and, wherever possible, takes reasonable steps to avoid placing anyone at a substantial disadvantage. School aims to work closely with disabled pupils, their families and any relevant outside agencies in order to remove or minimise any potential barriers to learning, which puts them at a disadvantage, but allows them to learn, achieve and participate fully in school life. The school is active in promoting positive attitudes to disabled people in school.

Contextual Information:

The main school building is 25+ years old whilst the dining area block is several years older still. The condition of the school building is reviewed by the governing body and the Liverpool ArchDiocese appointed Surveyors (Cunliffes Surveyors) on an annual basis. The local authority also undertakes an annual asset management survey. General day to day maintenance is actioned by the School Premises Manager. The school has a rolling programme of works for larger projects which are funded through the Devolved Formula Capital Grant or LCVAP Grant via Liverpool ArchDiocese. Smaller projects are funded directly from the school budget. Access to the main site, for those on foot, is made via the entrance on School Lane/Moss Lane. Visitors who attend the site by car have access to the school car park which has provision of 2 disabled parking bays.



Current Range of Known Disabilities:

English Martyrs Catholic Primary school has children with a range of disabilities that include moderate and specific learning disabilities, ASD and hearing impairment, amongst others. There are currently two members of staff with known back related issues and the school has made adaptations to their work environment as suggested by Occupational Health. As of December 2023, we have 1 child and 2 parents with disabilities who are accessing our site on a daily basis. Provision has been made for these parents and parking facilities in the school car park are available to them. Provision has been made for the child, who is in UKS2, by installation of a stairlift to enable access to the appropriate classroom.

We have a number of children who have asthma and all staff are aware of these children. Inhalers are kept in the appropriate Class medical box and a record of use is noted.

Some children have food allergies or intolerances/cultural food choices. Care plans are agreed where appropriate and photographs of these children are shared with the class teachers and lunchtime staff. Full details of medical conditions can be accessed by all staff via the Arbor system.

Information relating to a children's medical condition and/or specific needs are collected at the point of admission. Parents are able to request to amend these details via the Arbor app.

We have competent First Aiders who hold current First Aid certificates. As of December 2023 all teaching staff, teaching assistants, mid-day supervisors and office staff hold a first aid certificate. Certain staff have been trained in specific medical conditions for certain pupils. This information is available within the child's EHCP/Health Care Plan.

All medication is kept in a central safe and secure location within the individual year groups for easy access for First Aiders. 'Administration of medicine consent forms' are completed by parents/carers outlining the illness along with the amount of medicine and time medication should be administered. All medication that is administered is recorded. Staff log any medicine administered to pupils on the appropriate form held in each class area and the main office. Further details relating to Administering of Medicine can be found in the school policy 'Supporting Pupils with Medical Conditions'.

School has 2 Defibrillator on site, located in the main foyer and the dining hall. All staff have been trained in the use of this equipment and are aware of their location.
