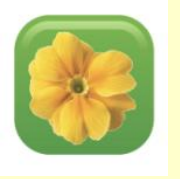

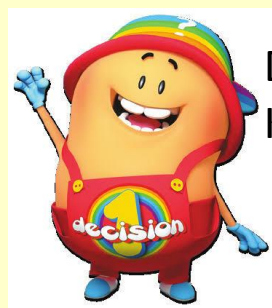

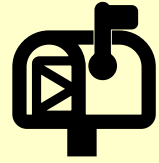

We strongly encourage good attendance to support your child's learning and progress.



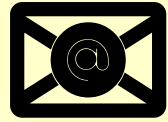
Just a reminder that Arbor can be used to report your child's absence.
