

Autumn Term Curriculum Letter – Year 3 Rivington

Dear Parents/Carers of Year 3 Rivington:

Welcome to the start of a new school year here at Primrose Hill. We're so pleased to welcome the children back to school and hope they're as excited as we are! Below is a brief outline of the areas we will be covering in the various subjects over the coming weeks.



During our daily English lessons this term we will continue to investigate a variety of different texts along with grammar work involving developing the use of a variety of sentence structures and appropriate punctuation. As always, it is hugely important that you read with your child at home on a regular basis. This year, we will be giving rewards every half term in class for those children that read at least three times a week. You can record

your child's reads on their reading record in the Showbie 'Homework and reading' file. As the books are getting longer, you can record the number of pages or chapters read each time, rather than waiting to record when the whole book is completed. Each week, all the reads will be counted and the reading display in class will be updated.

Maths lessons will continue to have a focus on place value and methods for calculating including mental calculation for all four operations. It is expected that by the end of Year 3 children know their 2, 5, 10, 3, 4, 8 and 11 times tables up and the related division facts. It is essential that children work on these at home to consolidate their work in school.



The Stone Age to Iron Age periods of history will be one of the main themes of class work this term, particularly the way in which human life changed throughout these time periods. We will be looking at their daily lives and key events within this time. Science this half term will cover rocks, fossils and soils in the first half term. The children will investigate how these are formed and compare and contrast different examples. After half term, we will be studying light, learning about how light travels, shadows and how they can change.

PSHE will provide the opportunity for children focus on the importance of keeping safe, being responsible and keeping safe online.



In RE, the children will be learning about the Islamic faith and Christianity in the build up to Christmas.

In Computing, children will be experimenting with programming and coding. We will also think about Online Safety relating to the power of passwords and thinking about an online community and how this applies to them.

In our PE lessons we will be covering fundamental movement skills, netball and swimming. These sessions will take place on a Tuesday and Thursday (swimming – after half term) so could you please ensure your child comes to school in their full PE kits for these days – we will be going outside for some sessions so <u>a tracksuit is advisable</u> for the later part of this term.

In Art & DT we will be focussing drawing and painting linking to our Stone Age topic work. We will also be creating a Stone Age themed mechanical book using linkages and levers.

The children will also continue to have the opportunity of learning to speak French on a weekly basis, as we will learn how to greet others and introduce ourselves, as well as basic 'How are you?' conversations.

Homework will start the week commencing 9th September and will be set via Showbie. A piece of English and a piece of Maths will be given each Wednesday, to be completed by the following Tuesday or earlier if completed sooner. The work can be completed either on Showbie or on paper. If work is written on paper, children should take a photo of this and upload it to Showbie, without the need for the paper to come back into school. Please ensure your child understands the importance placed on the prompt completion of all homework. Spellings will be tested on Mondays.

As you can see, it is certainly going to be a busy Autumn term in Year 3, but an interesting and varied one! If you have a particular expertise or interest in any of the above topics, please let us know.
