

Remote Learning Plan 2023-24



















This is Euxton Primrose Hill Primary School's plan for remote learning so that <u>all</u> children can continue with their education in the event that school is unexpectedly closed for any reason or if a child cannot attend school for a valid reason.

Initially, pupils in EYFS should access their remote learning via their Evidence Me account and pupils in Year1-6 via their Showbie account. In instances of individuals isolating, access to work will be provided within one working day of school being informed of an absence. Please don't forget that further remote learning for pupils can be found on the school website via the Learning Zone tab in the Pupil Tab and, where required, pupils will already have their login details for these. https://www.primrosehillschool.org.uk/learning-zone/.

Within your child's online account, you will find an overview of lessons to be completed each day. It will provide learning across the curriculum and children will be expected to spend a similar amount of time completing this as they would spend learning in school (Please refer to our Remote learning Policy for recommended learning times).

If a child does not have access to a tablet/computer/laptop and/or the internet, the school will do all it can to support children and will provide alternative ways of working if requested. Where funding can be accessed, remote devices (e.g. laptops) and/or 4G connections will be sought, particularly for disadvantaged children. Parents will be reminded to make the school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning.

An Overview of Remote Learning Available.

As part of our remote education provision via Showbie/Evidence Me, teachers may also signpost to other available resources that will support your child's learning. We will never direct you to a resource that you need to subscribe/pay for. The following information provides details of online learning resources:

Using White Rose Maths, children will be guided to the appropriate year group they are in and to one of the topics available that links to learning taking place in school where possible. Lessons include a video and subsequent questions.

ENGLISH		Our teachers will provide an overview of English sessions for the week based on what the other children in school will be learning. This means that if children complete these sessions and activities, when they return to school they won't have gaps in their English learning even though they may have missed some direct teaching. They will have shared the same texts and looked at the same or very similar skills.

The Oak National Academy.

The 'teaching content' will be provided to children through age appropriate video content on the DfE published list of educational resources site; Oak National Academy website. This provides the equivalent of 3 hours of lessons per day for primary school children. In their 'classroom' each lesson is an hour long. They're delivered by a teacher, with a pre-recorded video as well as quizzes, worksheets and creative activities. It's all easy to use, there's no login or password, and you can access the lessons on any device — pupils only need materials they can find at home.

Contact with pupils/ parents

Parents are able to contact the school via telephone or email (<u>office@primrosehill-euxton.lancs.sch.uk</u>) whilst your child is accessing remote learning, should support be required.

Providing feedback

Pupils can send any completed work to teachers to the class teacher via Showbie (KS 1 and 2) or Evidence Me (EYFS). Alternatively, work that children complete on paper should be kept safe and returned to school when possible.

Safeguarding

Staff will monitor that pupils are accessing work daily and attending our online Zoom sessions to account for pupils. Where staff cannot account for pupils, they will make contact with families. Where contact cannot be made, staff will refer the matter to a Designated Safeguarding Leader for further action, e.g. a socially distances home visit. Please also refer to Child Protection and Safeguarding Policy.

Data protection

When accessing personal data, all staff members will only use their official school email account and connect to the school network using their school laptop/ipad only.

Sharing personal data

Staff members are unlikely to need to collect and/or share personal data. However, if it does become necessary, staff are reminded to collect and/or share as little personal data as possible online. All data collection will be compliant with GDPR guidelines.

Monitoring arrangements

This policy will be reviewed by the SLT on an annual basis.
