SIGNIFICANT CHANGES TO PENALTY NOTICE CHARGES

The DfE have recently announced national charges to penalty notices issues for unauthorised absences in term time, these came into into effect on the 19th August 2024.

- Penalty notices issued for the offence after the 19th of August 2024 will be charged at the new rate of £160.00 however if paid in 21-days this reduces to £80.00.
- Any second penalty notice to the same parent for the same child in a rolling 3-year period will be issued at the rate of £160.00 to be paid within 28-days with no option for a discount.
- Penalty notice threshold is 10-sessions equivalent to 5-days of unauthorised absence in a rolling 10-school week period.
- Maximum of 2-penalty notices may be issued for the same child within a rolling 3-years period, so at the 3rd or subsequent offence another course of action will need to be considered such a prosecution or one of the other attendance legal interventions.

MEDICATION IN SCHOOL

If your child requires any prescribed medication during school hours, please inform the school office as soon as possible. As a rule, we are not able to administer medication to pupils, however we will always try to work with you to ensure the wellbeing of your child. We do store essential medications according to children's specific medical needs in school (for example: Epi-pens; inhalers, eczema creams etc.). Please **DO NOT** send any medication in with your child. This can be dangerous to other children. It must be handed in at the school office, by an adult, to an adult along with a completed medication form.

Dear Parents/Carers,

Firstly, I would like to thank all parents /carers who are already part of Children's University. As per the note on the Wednesday Weekly please find below in more detail how and what Children's University is about.

What is Children's University?

A national charitable organisation which celebrates learning that takes place outside of school hours. Pupils collect 'credits' for the time they spend outside of school hours participating in a variety of different learning activities.

How does it work?

Your child can collect 'credits' by:

- Attending after school clubs run by school.
- Attending 'Learning Destinations' in your area (such as swimming lessons, cubs, brownies, football training, gymnastics lessons, music lessons etc).
- Attending structured activity sessions at libraries, museums, farms, leisure centres and more across the whole country.
- By taking part in Children's University Challenges issued on the Wednesday Weekly.

What are the five golden rules?

- Learning must be voluntary.
- Learning must be outside of normal school hours.
- There must be structured learning taking place.
- Pupils can gain no more than 10 credits per activity per term (this is to encourage children to try lots of activities).
- All activities need to be accredited by Children's University and will display the Learning Destination Logo.

Pupils can collect their credits throughout the year and, if they reach a set target by the end of the year, are invited to graduate. Year 2 and Year 6 pupils will be invited to a graduation ceremony in partnership with our local University and pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Years 3 to 5 will have their graduation in school during celebration assembly.

Credits will be recorded within school for clubs your child attends and for evidence that is sent in by email to CU@primrosehill-euxton.lancs.sch.uk. This could be evidence of your child visiting a 'Learning Destination', a club they have attended out of school or challenges completed from the Wednesday Weekly. You can also purchase a Passport from school for you to record your child's credits throughout their time in school. The cost of a passport is £3.95.

If you would like your child to be part of Children's University, please complete the form on Parent Mail **by Friday 27**th **September**, also stating whether you require a passport. If you would like any further information, or have any questions about any of the above, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Finally, I would like to say a big thank you for your continued support and I look forward to receiving evidence and seeing what the children learn this year.
