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#### **CHICKENPOX**

Schools are often places where seasonal illnesses circulate, so we thought it would be useful to provide a short reminder about chickenpox — what it is, the common symptoms, and what to do if you think your child may be affected.

Chickenpox is a viral infection caused by the varicella-zoster virus. The illness often begins with a mild fever, aches, and tiredness, followed by an itchy red rash that develops into fluid-filled spots. These can appear anywhere on the body and usually form in successive waves over several days.

Chickenpox is usually mild in children, but it can cause complications in newborn babies, pregnant women, and people with weakened immune systems. It is highly infectious and spreads easily through coughs, sneezes, and direct contact with the fluid from the spots.

Exclusion is recommended – Children should be kept off school until all spots have crusted over, which is typically 5 days after the rash first appears.

Chickenpox: what you need to do

- Keep children at home until they are no longer infectious.
- Offer soothing treatments such as calamine lotion or cool baths to relieve itching.
- Seek medical advice if your child is very unwell, has difficulty breathing, or if you are pregnant or your child has a weakened immune system and has been exposed.
- Keep fingernails short to reduce the risk of skin infection from scratching.

#### SIGNIFICANT CHANGES TO PENALTY NOTICE CHARGES

The DfE have recently announced national charges to penalty notices issues for unauthorised absences in term time, these came into into effect on the 19th August 2024.

- Penalty notices issued for the offence after the 19th of August 2024 will be charged at the new rate of £160.00 however if paid in 21-days this reduces to £80.00.
- Any second penalty notice to the same parent for the same child in a rolling 3-year period will be issued at the rate of £160.00 to be paid within 28-days with no option for a discount.
- Penalty notice threshold is 10-sessions equivalent to 5-days of unauthorised absence in a rolling 10-school week period.
- Maximum of 2-penalty notices may be issued for the same child within a rolling 3-years period, so at the 3rd or subsequent offence another course of action will need to be considered such a prosecution or one of the other attendance legal interventions.
