Questions to think about

How might some people show that they 'belong' to God?

Where do I belong? What do we mean by family? Why might parents want their child baptised? What does it mean to belong to the Church family?

Key Learning

Christians believe in one God.

Christians believe that by being baptised, a person is welcomed into God's family (the church).

Infant baptism allows Christian parents to say thank you to God for the gift of their child.

Children are baptised in Church and the sign of the cross is made on the child's head using holy water to symbolise that they have joined God's family.

A baptismal candle is given.
