murti	Statues and pictures of Hindu gods placed on a shrine.
shrine	A place to worship.
deity	A god or goddess.



The Trímurti – the three most important Hindu gods.



Hindu homes will have at least one small shrine for daily worship.



Murti are statues of Hindu gods. This is a murti of Ganesha and Lakshmi.

The images of the deities in Hinduism are a visual representation of beliefs about God.
