Ole Kirk Christiansen (The man who created LEGO)

Key information

- Ole Kirk Christiansen was born in Denmark.
- He began by making simple wooden toys.
- Then in 1949 he created the 'LEGO' block.
- LEGO can now be bought all over the world and there are even amusement parks and movies dedicated to LEGO.

Key Learning

- Old toys were often wooden.
- For example wooden trains and dolls.
 - Old toys were usually handmade.
 - Some poor children would make their own toys out of objects such as pegs.
- Some toys such as teddies have hardly changed over time.
- New toys are often made from plastic and need batteries to operate.
