





Animal Amphibian	A living creature that is not a plant including a human. A small animal that is born in water and then lives on land for part of its life. Frogs and toads are kinds of amphibians. An animal with two
Bírd	wings, two feet, and feathers.
Físh	A fish is a creature that lives in water and has a tail and fins.
Mammal	Mammals are animals such as humans, dogs, and whales. In general, female mammals give birth to babies rather than laying eggs, and feed their young with milk.
Reptíle	Reptiles are a group of cold-blooded animals which have skins covered with small hard plates called scales and lay eggs.
Carnívore	An anímal that eats meat.
Herbívore	An animal that only eats plants.
Omnívore	An animal that eats plants and meat.
