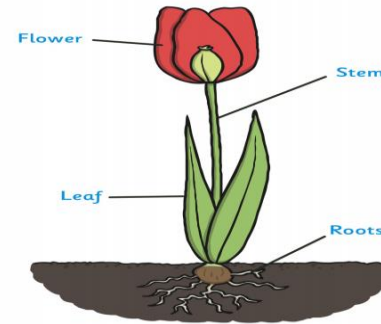

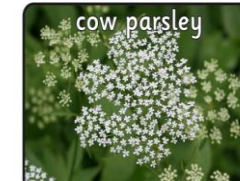
Key Vocabulary

Plant	A living thing that uses the sun to make food.
Flower	The part of the plant that has petals and makes fruit or seeds.
Stem	The part of the plant that grows up from the ground.
Roots	The part of the plant that usually grows underground. It soaks up water and keeps the plant in the soil.
Leaf	Is usually green and flat and grows from the stem.
Bulb	A plant bud that begins to grow underground.
Seed	The small part of a flowering plant that grows into a new plant.
Tree	A woody plant that has a long main trunk and many branches.
Evergreen	A tree that has green leaves which stay on throughout the year.
Deciduous	A tree that has leaves that drop off each year.

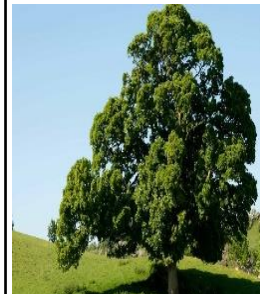
Wild Plants
