<u>Processes/Techniques</u>	
Step 1	Draw design onto polystyrene sheet
Step 2	Stick design onto wooden block
Step 3	Apply first colour using a roller and paint.
Step 4	Transfer printing block to paper pressing firmly.
Step 5	Allow to dry. Adapt block by adding raised detail.
Step 6	Repeat application process using a different colour, place directly over first print. Press firmly.
