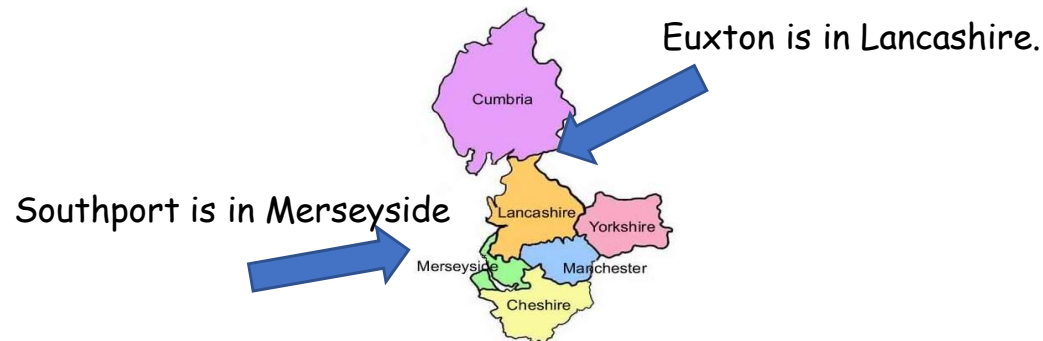

agriculture	Land used for farming animals and crops.
industry	Land used for making and producing things on a big scale (e.g. factories).

Southport	<p>Southport has many leisure facilities for tourists who visit.</p>	<p>Southport is a coastal town and has a 22 mile beach.</p>
Euxton	<p>Euxton is mainly residential but also has industrial parks like on Buckshaw Village.</p>	<p>River Yarrow flows through Euxton. We have a large amount of woodland and fields in the surrounding land.</p>

Key Learning

- There are 48 counties in England.
- Southport is in the county of Merseyside, whereas Euxton is in Lancashire.
- Southport is a coastal town, which means it is next to the sea.
- Lots of tourists visit Southport, so they have attractions like Pleasureland theme park, SplashWorld waterpark and Southport pier, the oldest iron pier in the country
- In Euxton, we have a lot of residential (housing) land use, as well as industrial land (factories & offices like on Buckshaw Village) and agricultural land use (farming.)
