

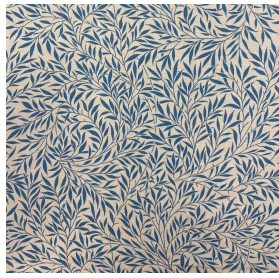

Materials and Media

Printing ink

Rollers

Ink tray

Vinyl

Visual Inspiration



Vocabulary

Lino print

A form of block printing that involves carving a pattern or design into a linoleum, rubber or vinyl surface that can then be printed from.

Rotation

Turning the block either clockwise or anti-clockwise to create a larger pattern.

Reduction Print

Made with a multi-coloured, layered print using a single print block.

Inking up

Applying ink to the block evenly. Using the right amount of ink. Too much increases drying time.

- Which order should you print the colours in and why?
- How can you ensure a clean and accurate print?
