The story of Rama and Sita

Rama's stepmother wanted her son to be king, and not Rama so she exiled Rama and his wife Sita, to the forest for 14 years. In the forest, the evil demon Ravana seizes Sita and takes her to his island home of Lanka. Rama follows a trail of Sita's jewellery and then meets Hanuman, the monkey-king. Hanuman and Rama defeat Ravana then, their exile over. Rama returns home with Sita. The people light their way home with little lamps called diva lamps left outside their homes.

What is Raksha Bandhan?

Raksha Bandhan is a Hindu festival, usually celebrated in August.

Raksha Bandhan is also known as Rakhi.



It celebrates and strengthens the bond of love between brothers and sisters.

Traditions of Raksha Bandhan



Brothers and sisters face each other.

The sisters tie a Rakhi (bracelet) made from coloured cotton or silk around their brother's wrist.



The Rakhi symbolises protection from evil.

Red and gold threads are popular Rakhi colours and some bracelets also have beads and jewels on them.
