We already know that some nouns are masculine and some are feminine. Certain adjectives change depending on which. This is called agreeing.

un garçon petit - a small boy

une fille petite - a small girl

Negative forms of verbs

When we are saying we **don't** do something in French, we wrap the negative around the verb with **ne** and **pas**.

Je sais - I know
Je **ne** sais **pas** - I don't know
