This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Music is taught overtly in class every week as a timetabled lesson and is informed by the model music curriculum (March 2021). Lessons are a minimum of 30 minutes and are taught by class teachers, teaching is supported by specialist planning and the *Sing Up* curriculum scheme of work. This musical learning is further supplemented by weekly singing assemblies in each key stage,

All pupils also receive a 30 minute drum sessions led by Kinetika Bloco and in addition to this also have a 15 minutes music assembly.

Part B: Extra-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

At Evolve Academy, we do not offer extra-curricular music opportunities ourselves. However, our music partner, Kinetika Bloco [Youth Organisation in London | Kinetika Bloco](#) offers easter schools, summer schools and leadership opportunities.

Kinetika Bloco deliver Bloco drumming to all primary students weekly, and steel pan quartet teaching weekly for KS2 students with an obvious music ability.

These lessons are part funded by Pupil Premium. All ensembles are free and accessible to all of the Primary cohort.

Part C: Musical events

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.
