2021-25:

Throughout my time as chair of Friends of Fairfield Primary we have had a rollercoaster ride. Covid, cost-of-living and energy crisis.

Through all of this I am pleased to say that we have been able to continue to support the school, through fundraising and volunteering.

Funding focus:

This year our funding focus has continued to be our two large projects: two main aims.

- $\cdot$  Reading Realm school lead funding for an outdoor classroom, which is dedicated to literacy, imagination, reading and storytelling. We reached our target of £14,000 for this in Spring and the Reading Realm was built and installed in May half term. It was lovely to see photos of classes using this in the summer team, and as the temperature warms up and spring returns, it would be great this being used more.
- · Sensory Hub This project was started in spring '23 by parents Jason and Helen, to develop a Sensory Hub in a vacant room in the school. Specifically designed safe space for children with sensory needs. We have been able to support this project by applying for funding, managing the accounts, holding fundraising events. We raised over £13,000. This has been in used since the end of November and it's a delight to see it used. We look forward to its launch in the near future.
