In recent weeks, the children have been focussing on calculations involving multiplication and division and they have been enjoying solving problems around this. What has been happening across our school?

Nursery are exploring colour over the next few weeks. We are reading 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear' by Eric LaCarle and learning how to retell stories. Next week love will be in the air as we make valentines cards and look at Lunar New Year Celebrations across the world.

Reception continue to work hard to learning their new digraphs (2 letters making one sound). They will continue to learn about Winter and how to notice its affects before looking forward to Spring with Valentines celebrations.

Year 1 had a marvellous time at their Royal Tea party last week. They made their own sandwiches and decorated bunting in advance of the King's visit. When the King arrived, they practised their best curtseys and bows. They then listened to military music whilst they ate their party food. What fun!

Year 2 have been learning about Kings and Queens. They have also started practising their airs and graces, because they are about to meet two of Britain's marvellous monarchs in their workshop all about the Monarchs! In RE they are learning about Judaism, and are going to bake delicious challah bread.

Year 3 "What a wonderful World" is a great topic. In Geography, the children have explored the difference between physical and human features and learning about longitude and latitude! For the next couple of weeks, they will be learning more facts about the country of Spain and this will all build into their final piece of writing where they will write a non-chronological report.

Year 4 have been learning about States of Matter and have been really investigating and thinking like scientists. The children have written detailed, informative leaflets for younger children in school to teach them about everything they have learnt in this topic.

Year 5 have enjoyed learning about mountains, earthquakes and volcanoes over the past few weeks and are now writing biographies about Edmund Hillary and his mission to become one of the first people to reach the summit of Mount Everest. They are looking forward to learning more about their topic at the Natural History Museum this week.

Year 6 enjoyed a chilly trip to London Zoo! Seeing all the animals and learning lots of facts that they have been sharing in school. Whilst at the Zoo they began thinking about whether zoos should in fact, be banned? Is it cruel to keep animals in a zoo or is there a purpose to it? They then used this as a bias for writing a balanced argument about zoos.
