What has been happening across our school?

Nursery – Recently, have been reading 'The 3 Billy Goats Gruff'. The children have really enjoyed acting it out and using different voices to be the characters. We have built lots of bridges and obstacle courses, which we have walked, crawled, climbed, 'trip trapped' over. As teachers we have been impressed by the children trying something new, even when they think they cannot do it. Reception - have been

securing their understanding of number by looking at odd and even numbers to 10. They have even built their own snack shop, where they chose their snack and pay for it using a price list. They have been really working hard with Phonics too, they have become more confident in blending and therefore reading. They loved the tricky word 'Shoot the car' game which had them speeding cars into words and reading the word it landed on.

Year 2's - have had a great and busy start to the summer term; The children have had lots of opportunities to showcase their acting skills through drama. During music, the children have loved learning a new song about friendship. In Science, we are learning about life cycles and recently we had a visitor who answered all their questions about babies and toddlers. This term. we have also talked a lot about our school values, and it has been lovely to see the children regularly demonstrate these.

Year 3's- topic is the 'Secret Garden'. In Science we will explore the requirements of plants for life and growth and how they vary from plant to plant. We are also going to explore the part that flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants, including pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal. We cannot wait to see the Year 3 plant themed homework projects. In maths we will be continuing to develop the children's knowledge of fractions by learning how to add/subtract and find fractions of amounts. https://www.topmarks.co.uk /maths-games/7-11years/fractions-anddecimals

Year 4 – are learning about music from around the world and have been enjoying listening to some Bob Marley!

Year 5 - have thrown themselves into our learning about the Maya, finding out where they came from and how they survived in the rainforests and deserts of Central America. We have also had a go playing a Maya ball game - although we did not sacrifice the losing team to please the gods! In Science and PSHE we are learning about the human lifecycle and how our bodies change as we get older.

Year 6 - We would like to take this opportunity to wish all our Year 6 children luck in their upcoming SATs tests. They have worked incredibly hard so far this year and we know they will continue to shine. We are immensely proud of everything they have, and continue to, achieve this year.

Soon they have a lovely trip to The National Art Gallery in London to look forward too and a workshop with Heathrow Airport too.

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Year 1 - have been working so hard on their reading and phonics and are making great progress with this. It is lovely listening to the children talk about what they want to do when they are older and how reading will help them to achieve this. Recently, the Year 1 children had a fantastic morning with the tropical zoo as part of their topic, 'Old Macdonald'. They saw lots of animals including insects, spiders, snakes and a cuddly chinchilla. They enjoyed describing how they thought the animals might feel and behave like.




The 1-minute maths app helps children build greater number confidence and fluency. It is all about targeted practice in engaging, one-minute chunks!
